

Landshipping

Landshipping

The bay at Landshipping Quay (SN009109) provides a good vantage point for a large stretch of the Daugleddau with views over to Sprinkle Pill, Hook and the Western Cleddau. Park in the lay-by at SN009109, ideally some 2 hours after high tide when birds start to come in as the tide drops. See map In the bay itself Teal and Wigeon are always present in the winter together with variable numbers of Curlew, Redshank, Dunlin, Oystercatcher, Lapwing and occasionally Black Tailed Godwit. Wintering Greenshank and Spotted Redshank are also regular here. Over on the other side of the river at Sprinkle Pill a large flock peaking at several thousand Golden Plover roosts on the mudflats and the wintering flock of Canada Geese is also present. Good numbers of Little Egret can also be seen here and Peregrine may be seen attacking the waders.

Spring and Autumn brings the chance to see migrating waders and the possibility of a passing Osprey which are seen most years.

The slipway at Landshipping Ferry (SN012118) is worth a visit with views of the Eastern Cleddau. Again Waders and Wildfowl will be seen and occasionally Red Breasted Merganser.

Garron Pill

Park by the road at SN 020078 for views down Garron Pill and Beggars Reach - see <u>map</u>. This is a good spot for wintering Greenshanks. Little Egrets, Redshanks, Curlew and Wildfowl are usually present and Jack Snipe may be flushed from the long grass near the road.

Lawrenny

Park by the side of the road at SN018065 for good views of the Cresswell and Carew Rivers. See <u>map</u>. Much the same species can be expected as described above.
