About Workshop	<p>The workshop is organized as part of the Inter Pares Partnership with the National Assembly of Botswana. The partnership facilitates the exchange of knowledge, experiences and practices between the National Assembly of Botswana and EU Member States Parliaments on several priority themes, including representation and citizen engagement.</p> <p>The National Assembly has made important steps forward to open up the parliament to citizens. This includes the creation of the innovative Botswana Speaks platform which connects citizens with MPs and facilitates policy dialogue between the public and the parliament. The National Assembly is currently interested in attracting more users to the platform and transforming it into a more effective communication channel between MPs and citizens. The Parliament is also interested in introducing a new system of citizen petitions.</p> <p>Strengthening the engagement with the civil society organizations and intensifying public consultations across parliamentary committees is another priority area which the National Assembly looks forward to enhancing.</p> <p>In response to the above, the workshop gathers the Members and staff of the National Assembly of Botswana, local civil society organizations, representatives of the Parliament of Denmark (Folketing), the French National Assembly and international expert scholars, to reflect on the role of civil society engagement with parliaments and to discuss effective mechanisms for enhancing Parliament-CSO collaboration.</p>
