PACE Lesson/Assignment Overview for Week of 4/20-4/24

All lessons, assignments, and activities are posted on your child's Google Classroom for each class, including Specials.

This week we will continue with our thematic work (letter of the week). This week we will focus on learning opportunities that begin with the letter **J**.

Please review our learning plan, below, and the schedule we have provided. All of the students' learning activities can be located in our PACE Google Classroom.

The weekly plan will be updated every Monday, with new activities based on the letter of the week. At a minimum, if you are able to print out page 2 that will be helpful, as the format resembles the daily schedule each student follows within their typical school day. You may want to hang the weekly schedule in a central location such as the refrigerator, or clip it to a special clipboard or other secure location that you determine.

If your child is able to mark with a "🗸", "⑤" as they complete that portion of the schedule, have them do so. If assistance is needed; you can still have them involved by giving them a choice "Would you like me to use a red or blue pen to check it off?" and have them point to their preferred pen and you mark it off yourself. Even if they are not actively completing the specific activities at that time (or if they only spend a few minutes on an activity during that time interval) it is still helpful to refer back to the expectation each time block.

The goal for now is to establish a routine, enjoy reinforcing skills already learned, and move on to new skills once your child is ready. Your child may benefit from watching or listening to a parent or sibling start the activity to build momentum-this is fine too! In this scenario they are still engaged, building receptive language and communication, and it provides them with a model or example of what is expected from them.

Theme of the Week: The Letter "J"

Plan for Differentiation: Each menu starting on page 3 provides an assortment of activities for all different levels. Please help your child choose an appropriate activity/lesson under each heading daily.
