

"Build Your House On The Rock"

Discussion Guide: Inspired By Minister Edith Mulligan

In this sermon titled 'Build Your House on the Rock,' the minister draws from Matthew 7:24-27 to challenge believers to establish their lives on a solid, godly foundation. Jesus is described as the rock, the Chief Cornerstone, and the only foundation that will not crack or crumble when the storms of life arrive. Just as the wise man in the parable built on rock and withstood the rain and floods, those who hear and obey God's Word will find their spiritual house standing firm against every attack of the enemy. The pastor's closing remarks reinforced the sermon's call to action: getting our houses in order means examining the quality of our personal relationship with Jesus Christ. The message emphasized that a solid foundation includes love, forgiveness, obedience, righteousness, faith, and prayer. Believers were encouraged to invest in eternal things, trust God as their stronghold, and pursue holiness so they can, as one workshop speaker put it, 'get home safely.'

Intro Prayer

Heavenly Father, we come before You today with open hearts and willing spirits. As we gather to discuss Your Word, we ask that You quiet our minds and remove any distractions that would keep us from hearing what You want to speak to each of us personally. Lord, just as You call us to build our lives on the solid rock of Jesus Christ, we ask that You lay a fresh foundation in this group today. May Your Holy Spirit guide every word spoken, every question asked, and every answer shared. Let this time draw us closer to You and to one another. In Jesus' name, amen.

Ice Breaker

If you were building your dream home, what is one feature you would absolutely have to include, and why?

Key Verses

- Matthew 7:24-27
- John 14:2-3
- Isaiah 54:17

Questions

- The sermon describes Jesus as the rock, the Chief Cornerstone, and a solid foundation. What does it mean to you personally to have Jesus as your foundation, and how does that show up in your daily life?
- Matthew 7:24-27 contrasts a wise builder and a foolish builder. In what areas of your life do you feel you are building wisely, and in what areas might you be building on shaky ground?
- The minister used the story of the Three Little Pigs as an illustration. How does that story connect to the spiritual truth of building on a solid foundation, and what 'huffing and puffing' from the enemy have you experienced in your own life?
- The pastor asked a pointed question: if you were to pass away right now, do you have the assurance that you are going home to heaven? How would you answer that question honestly, and what does your answer reveal about the state of your foundation?
- The sermon listed several building materials for a godly foundation, including love, forgiveness, obedience, righteousness, faith, and prayer. Which of these do you feel is strongest in your life right now, and which one needs the most attention?
- The closing pastor said, 'It is your faith that brought you here today.' How has personal faith, not someone else's faith, shaped your walk with God? Can you share a moment when your own faith made a real difference?
- The message warned against waiting too long to build on the rock, saying 'when the night comes, no man can work.' What does that urgency mean to you, and how does it motivate you to act on your faith today rather than later?
- The sermon encouraged believers to pursue holiness as the path to 'getting home safely.' How do you understand the relationship between holiness and a secure foundation in Christ, and what practical steps help you pursue holiness in your everyday life?

Life Application

This week, take time to do a personal 'foundation inspection.' Set aside 15 to 20 minutes each day to honestly evaluate one area of your life, such as your prayer life, your relationships, your habits, or your thought patterns, and ask yourself whether that area is built on the rock of God's Word and His promises. Choose one specific action you can take to strengthen your foundation in that area, whether it is starting a daily Bible reading plan, reaching out to reconcile a broken relationship, or committing to a regular prayer time. Come back next week ready to share what you discovered and what step you took.

Key Takeaways

- Jesus Christ is the only solid foundation. He is the rock that will not crack or crumble, and any life built on Him will withstand the storms, floods, and attacks that come.
- Hearing God's Word is not enough. The wise builder both hears and does what Jesus says. Obedience is what separates a solid foundation from a shaky one.
- A godly foundation must be built intentionally with love, forgiveness, obedience, righteousness, faith, and prayer. These are not optional extras but essential building materials.
- The enemy can huff and puff, but he cannot destroy a life that is anchored in Christ. No weapon formed against a believer built on the rock will ultimately prosper.
- Building on the rock is an urgent, personal decision. Each person must examine their own relationship with Jesus Christ and act while there is still time, because eternal life depends on the foundation we choose.

Lord Jesus, we thank You for the truth of Your Word and for the reminder that You are the only foundation worth building on. As we leave this discussion, we ask that You seal everything we have shared and learned deep in our hearts. Where our foundations have cracks, Lord, be the mortar that holds us together. Where we have been building on sand, give us the courage and the grace to start again on solid ground. Help us to be not just hearers of Your Word but doers, building daily with love, faith, forgiveness, and obedience. We declare together that we want to get home safely, and we trust You to lead us there. Protect us, strengthen us, and keep our eyes fixed on You, the rock of all ages.
