This guide has been prepared to give you a clear understanding of your child's performance and progress toward meeting our district's expectations related to standards of learning.

How can I support my student(s) at home?

 We are in the process of developing standards-aligned resources for families to access at this location.

What does a full report card look like?

 This example report card allows you to see an example of a Grade 5 Report Card with all standards assessed. A Grade 6 report card will look similar to this.

What standards are we using for our report cards?

- <u>Content Standards</u>: The Vermont State Board of Education selects standards for Vermont's schools. <u>Click here to see Vermont's standards of learning</u>. To maximize information to families about student performance while also controlling the overall length of the report card, standards have been condensed into informative clusters.
 - ELA: Student performance is reported by major <u>Common Core Anchor Standard</u>: Reading/Literature, Reading/Informational Text,
 Reading/Foundational Skills, Writing, Speaking & Listening, and Language.
 - Math: Student performance is reported by major Common Core Domains. To read about these domains, <u>click here</u>.
 - Other subjects: Each subject goes through yearly iterations of improvement on reporting categories. For science and social studies, performance is currently reported in the categories of inquiry and understanding concepts. Over the next few years, MVSU will evaluate how to best report on specific C3 and Next Generation Science Standards.

How does grading work?

• Teachers assess students on a 1-4 point scale. They enter assessment scores for standards into an open, online gradebook in Alma. Parents can view these scores at any time. The grades on the report card represent a running average of all scores in that category. If you have questions about assessment scores, report card grades, or how to access the online gradebook, please contact your child's teacher. It is important to note that not all standards are addressed every year or trimester. Only the standards that are being taught and being assessed will appear on the report card.
