Michigan Online

- What is Michigan Online?
 - Michigan Online is a destination for online learning opportunities created by the University of Michigan. It is both a portal to allow discovery of our online learning experiences, as well as a platform that allows the university to host self-contained learning experiences.

• Why Michigan Online?

Michigan Online is an ideal platform for this learning community because it allows us to organize the modular content that makes up this learning community in a form that, while currently linear, is flexible enough to grow with the project. Over time we will be working to develop novel new interfaces and tools to help learners navigate the modular content in ways that reveal connections between topics within this course, and to external resources of interest.
