Lieutenant Colonel David L. Hartline was born on a cotton farm in Cherokee County in Northeast Alabama. He was drafted into the U.S. Army in January 1968 where he served as a recon scout in Vietnam, was wounded twice, and

received several medals. When retiring after 23 years, David continued his education while serving as a police officer and chief of police. He became a college instructor, and he is the author of four books on military experience, which appeared on the best seller list, rated 5 stars. AAFES purchased the books and sent him on a national book signing tour to all the military bases.

David began conducting motivational speaking to troops; he continued these speeches for 35+ years. As an officer in the Tennessee Guard Headquarters in Nashville, TN, during Desert Storm David was involved in sending radiograms from the Opry Land Hotel to the troops in Iraq for two days.

During Desert Storm, David's leadership earned him 2 medals of achievement.

David was named veteran of the year by the Governor of Alabama and was also chosen as Legionnaire of the year by Alabama American Legion, where he served as the state commander. He was proclaimed super citizen by TBS Television Station.

David has dedicated 50 years of his life assisting veterans and their families with the many problems they have as well as assisting any needy persons in the community.

David and his wife, Patricia, have raised 4 children. They have 10
