For example, if two groups are interested in the same area (like New York), and both parties are comfortable with one being a subchapter of the other, this is also an acceptable arrangement.

All discussions about regional assignments and adjustments should remain civil and respectful to ensure smooth cooperation between chapters. Our goal is to foster a unified and supportive network that drives the mission of Mito Matters forward.
