

# Jay County Amateur Radio Club Emergency Repeater Net

Protocol - Rev 9-9-17 Approved by J.C.A.R.C. Do not copy without permission.

1. During an emergency event, the Primary Repeater Frequency will be **[443.475+ MHz, 100 Hz PL Tone]**.
2. Pager will be used to alert P25 members. If pager is accidentally pushed, please indicate by saying, "Please disregard test," and indicate your call.
3. Group texting may also be used to alert active hams.
4. Link function may be activated. Primary Link Repeater: **[145.250- MHz, 107.2 Hz PL Tone]**. Use **[442.675+ Mhz, 107.2 Hz PL Tone]** and **[145.210- MHz, 97.4 Hz PL Tone]** as secondary repeaters.
5. Primary 2 meter simplex **147.540 MHz**, secondary simplex **146.550 MHz** will be used for local communications.
6. Primary 70 cm simplex **446.150 MHz**, secondary simplex **446.100 MHz** will be used for local communications.
7. During the emergency, the net controller will access the repeater and announce the event.
8. Depending on the emergency, the net controller will ask for detailed information regarding the event including weather reports, weather information, or assistance to the event.
9. All stations will use the following protocol:

*You are on the net and want to speak up or have valuable information, please follow these examples:*

- a. **KX9KKL: Question** (*When you would like to ask a question*)
- b. **KX9KKL: Comment** (*When you want to throw in your 2¢*)
- c. **KX9KKL: Info** (*When you can provide additional information or answer a question*)

10. Always wait for the net controller to call you.
11. When the net controller calls you, give your call sign right away.
12. Always address the group and finish with your call.
13. Never address, call, or communicate with others unless the net controller asks you to.
14. Use standard phonetics when describing to eliminate confusion. Alpha, Beta, Charlie, etc.
15. Follow FCC rules at all times.
16. Respect the repeater and net controller at all times.
17. Remember the time-out on the repeaters.
18. Any club member of the Jay County Amateur Radio Club can initiate the emergency net as the Net Controller during an actual emergency.
19. Should an actual emergency exist, it is necessary that each check-in identify themselves and report in as a base or mobile with type of power source (battery, generator, or household power).
