- <u>Finding Open Child Care Providers</u> Many child care facilities have reopened to help support families. During this uncertain time, the DECE staff is working hard to track the facility closures as they are reported. Parents looking for child care can access the South Carolina Child Care link to view open and closed early childhood programs.
- <u>Kinship Care Resources</u> During times of crisis, families sometimes need to make arrangements for children.
- <u>Pandemic-EBT</u> Emergency SNAP supplements are only for those households already receiving SNAP benefits or households who meet all income and other eligibility requirements for the regular SNAP program. SNAP households who already receive the maximum benefit amount will not receive an emergency supplement.
- <u>Sanitation/Cleaning Grant</u> A one-time grant funding available for license-exempt providers enrolled in the ABC Quality program and not operating in a school building to

clean and sanitize their child care facility to reopen; or to continue to purchase additional cleaning supplies or services necessary to keep the center or child care home safe and sanitary.

- <u>SCRemoteLearning.com</u> A website offering digital teaching and learning resources for teachers, parents and students, was launched in response to the pandemic. The Office of Early Learning and Literacy has developed a month-long sequence of lesson plans and instructional resources for teachers for grades PreK to 5th grade. The lessons include both virtual resources like online videos as well as lessons that can be used by teachers for non-virtual instruction.
