Preparing the paper, authors are kindly requested to adhere to the following guidelines. We accept submissions strictly online, via the form available at our website: <https://global-rudn.ru/en/submit>

Submit papers of **no more than 3 or 4 pages exactly (3,5 or 2,8 - not suitable)** in length including results, figures and references. Should your paper exceed the aforementioned limits, the editorial board will carry out the final decision on its publication based on recommendations from your reviewer.

The body of the text should start with a brief introduction, describing the paper's significance. In the case of an original study, the body of the paper should follow a common structured approach to the description of the studies aim, its materials, methods and results, as well as Discussion and Conclusions sections.

The typescripts and manuscripts should be *followed*:

1. Typescripts (Programme: Microsoft Word, Font - Times New Roman), format file: *.docx, *.doc.
2. Use the dot as the decimal separator.
3. The manuscript should meet the following requirements:
-A4 sized paper should be used,
-Margins: left - 49 mm, right - 49 mm, top – 61 mm, and bottom 65 mm,
-Font size: main body text, footnotes, references & attachments, tables - 10 pt,
-Line spacing – single, Spacing: Before: 0, After: 0, Alignment: Justified,

Indentation – 1,25,

- Leave an empty line between sections.

The list of references should be complete and accurate. In the text all citations should be pointed as [1] or [1, p. 10] or [1,2], where the number refers to the reference in the list. Please do not use footnotes for citation.

2. Methodology and Data

Symbols denoting vectors and matrices should be indicated in bold type. Scalar variable names should normally be expressed using italics. All non-standard abbreviations or symbols must be defined when first mentioned. Equations and formulas must be denoted by numbers in round parentheses on the right hand side of the page (if referred to explicitly in the text). Please create them using Word 2007 or 2010 Equation Editor or Mathtype (not a picture).

3. Results and Discussion

Figures and tables should be embedded and not supplied separately. Tables and figures have to be numbered and references to them must be included in the text (tab. 1). Please pay attention to the alignment of tables and figures in the text.

Tables have to be centred, numbered continuously, and referenced in the text. Please, use caption format as given here. Feel free to use cross-referencing feature of your typewriting software. Tables should not be wider than the margins of the paper. Leave an empty line before and after each table.



Lines in the table should be single, standard thickness, minimum number of horizontal lines is taking out 3. There are no verticals (see the

example). Numbers put in the table should be in the alignment formats, i.e. with the same number of decimal places (the maximum number of decimal places is taking out 4).

All figures should be numbered with Arabic numerals. Every figure should have a caption. All photographs, schemas, graphs and diagrams are to be referred to as figures. Line drawings should be true electronic output. Figures must be embedded into the text without borders and not supplied separately. In MS Word input the figures must be properly coded. Lettering and symbols should be clearly defined either in the caption or in a legend provided as part of the figure. Figures should be placed at the top or bottom of a page wherever possible, as close as possible to the first reference to them in the paper (fig. 1). Artwork has no text along the side of it in the main body of the text. However, if two images fit next to each other, these may be placed next to each other to save space. Figures should be high-quality graphics vector drawings. Size: max 12.4 cm x 16 cm.
