





President's Update...

Sisters and Brothers,

Over six months ago, right after our new four year collective bargaining agreement was ratified and signed, the LCSD community received news that our Superintendent of Schools would be retiring. The news brought a mixed bag of responses from our membership, but highlighted the next area of focus for the LEA. How would we help to influence and drive the selection of our next district leader?

Initial inquiries to the individual charged with running the search, Dr. Clark Godshall of O/N BOCES, were met with resistance. However, in collaboration with the Lockport Service Employees Association (LSEA) and Lockport Administrators and Supervisors Association (LASA), the LEA approached the Board of Education to express the necessity of being a larger part of the process and making sure that our collective voices were heard, respected, and considered.

In early October, the LEA officers and our immediate past President were provided with an opportunity to meet with members of the Board of Education and our Interim Superintendent. At that meeting, the LEA provided a detailed picture of the concerns we had, the characteristics we wanted to see in the next Superintendent, and our hopes for further participation in the interview process. I thank the many members who completed the survey to assist us in this process.

Over the months of November and December, applications were accepted for the position and sorted through by the Board of Education. Initial rounds of interviews were conducted confidentially and the field narrowed to three finalists. As President of the LEA, I received notification in late December that the LEA would be provided a seat at the table with other stakeholders for the finalist interviews. Of significance was that our stakeholders group would be afforded the opportunity to interview the candidates without any district administration present, or LCSD Board of Education members.

For each candidate, the LEA presented multi-step questions that articulated our membership concerns. These questions originated from our survey to membership in October, and were ranked and voted on by the LEA officers. At the conclusion of each candidate's interview, our stakeholders group would rate the strengths and weaknesses of the candidates and provide them to the Board of Education.







At the conclusion of three days of interviews, it was very clear to our stakeholders group that a strong candidate had emerged and risen to the top. The personality, educational pedigree, vision, and responses to our questions highlighted the consensus that Dr. Calvin was the right person for the position. As your representative at the table, I will tell you I was extremely pleased with the process we followed, the questions we were allowed to ask, and the candidate that was selected in the end by the Lockport Board of Education.

I eagerly look forward to getting back to doing the work of the LEA with a leader who is prepared to work with us. During the last few weeks I arranged communications with the union leadership of his former district and gathered insight into how we might best forge ahead with Dr. Calvin.

As always, my greatest thanks goes to the members of the LEA who took the time to be a part of the process. To answer the surveys, provide feedback, ask critical questions and engage in the efforts to make our jobs, and the education of our students just a little bit better.














4th Annual LEA March Madness Bowling Event- March 17, 2022 3pm

NYSUT Has an Ambitious Legislative Agenda

NYSUT is looking to expand on our victories from 2022. The top of that list continues to be fixing Tier 6 (and 5). Last year, we were able to cut the vesting time from 10 years to 5 for these members. This year we will continue the fight to fix Tier 6 (and 5). NYSUT is also pushing for:

Safe Schools for All

We are seeking:

- Access to more mental health professionals
- Union representatives on school safety committees
- Passage of the School Workplace Violence Protection Act

Higher Education

We are seeking:

- Additional \$350 million each for SUNY and CUNY for mental health professionals
- \$440 million in base aid for SUNY community colleges and \$230 million in base aid to CUNY community colleges

Other Priorities

We are seeking:

- Reform APPR to restore local control over teacher evaluations
- Eliminate the receivership process
- Build on the success of the NYC class size bill and expand statewide
- Continue the fight against the expansion of charter schools and enact reforms to hold them accountable
- Ensure that year three of fully funding Foundation Aid actually occurs

I will be going to Albany in early March to participate in the Committee of 100. We will be meeting with elected officials in an effort to gain support for our legislative initiatives. This fight is our fight! It doesn't happen without a united front from our over 600,000 members statewide. As we look ahead, our VOTE/Cope campaign will be starting this spring. VOTE/Cope funds are crucial to our ability to fight for the rights of all our members. Stay tuned for more legislative updates. Our VOTE/Cope campaign will kick off in a few short months.

Now that 2022 has come to an end, people will likely begin to think about filing their taxes. Of the almost <u>530 current LEA</u> (secret phrase) members, there are a total of 21 different amounts that members contributed in union dues for the 2022 calendar year. The two reasons why everyone's is not the same are:

- The dues category in which members fall. There
 are three different dues categories; full dues,
 three-quarters dues, and split dues. The category
 in which members fall is solely based upon their
 annualized salary.
- 2. The amount of days in which a member was paid. This includes members who were hired after the first pay date of the 2022 calendar year (specifically 01/14/2022) as well as members who had taken an unpaid leave.

I have linked this PDF file that is my personal paystub from 12/30/2022 (with some of the information redacted) to help you find the exact amount that you - specifically YOU - contributed in union dues for the 2022 calendar year.

Please be sure to look at your pay stub from the specific date of 12/30/2022. In addition, many members often wonder what each of the acronyms and abbreviations represent on their pay stub. Please refer to this linked PDF file for assistance with that.


