Dozens of courses are currently available for free, and ESCs can also partner with the OLC to create courses for free or for fee on their own tenant within the OLC. Please help them get the message out! They are willing to meet and speak with curriculum directors to discuss professional development opportunities. Courses are free, ability to earn college credit and certificates All ESCs have the ability to put courses, materials, and communities of practice on the platform at no charge for you to use.
