
Good evening Highland High School families, this is Mr. Zack and here are your Thursday's Thoughts for January 14, 2021. There are 5 items of interest to follow. I am targeting 2 minutes of time with these from here on out, so if you miss any part of the message, please visit the Highland High School webpage on our Live Feed where there is a link to view this in its entirety as well as a link having been emailed to your primary email account.

- 1. Seniors very important especially those of you who have passed the ASVAB test. You need to be sure to turn in your graduation pathway form. These have been sent to you earlier in the year and will be sent to your school email address again from Mr. Belli. This form is required to use the ASVAB as an alternate test to the ISTEP+. If you do not return that completed form, you will have to come in and take the ISTEP+ test again. Mom's and Dad's please check with your kiddos to be sure that they have accomplished this vital step.
- 2. Important upcoming dates regarding testing and eLearning:
 - a. Tuesday, January 26th eLearning date PSAT testing for all 9th grade students and those in 10th and 11th who were unable to take the test in the fall. This is the last date for the PSAT test this school year.
 - b. Wednesday, February 3rd eLearning date ISTEP+ Math testing for all 11th grade students, and those 12th grade students who did not pass the ISTEP+ test. Those seniors who took the test in the fall will know the week of January 25th your results and if you need to come in to test on this date.
 - c. Wednesday, February 10th eLearning date ISTEP+ ELA testing for all 11th grade students and those 12th grade students who did not pass the ISTEP+ test. Those seniors who took the test in the fall will know the week of January 25th your results and if you need to come in to test on this date.
 - d. Juniors there will be information in your Main Office Google Classroom regarding ISTEP+ practice test information. Seniors, you have already participated in your practice test in the fall and are exempt from the practice test again.
- 3. It's hard to believe but it is time to start the scheduling process for the 2021-22 school year!
 - a. Scheduling information will be available online early next week and an email will go out to students and parents on how to access this information on Tuesday.
 - b. For planning purposes, the Class of 2022 will schedule between January 25th and February 5th with specific information being available on January 20th. The Class of 2023 & 2024 will schedule between February 8th and February 19th with specific information being available on February 1st. The Class of 2025 will schedule between February 22nd and March 5th with specific information being available on February 16th. All students will have the opportunity to schedule a virtual appointment with their counselor during these times should they wish.
- College Board is hosting our first-ever series of virtual college fairs called BigFuture™ Days.
 Encourage sophomores and juniors at your school to sign up for a chance to connect directly

with college admissions representatives and current college students. They'll have a chance to explore colleges in a way that's not overwhelming, ask questions about topics they want to learn about, and take action on key college planning steps.
