#### Task 2: Classroom Routines

- Discuss your classroom routines.
- Come up with a list of 3-5 routines to suggest to other teachers.
- Report back to the group.

• Ideas: warm-ups, activities, approaches to teaching, student engagement, tech-check, etc.

#### **Breakout Room 1**

### Classroom Routines:

Students read aloud, teacher repeats - pronunciation
Waiting to start the lesson 10mins - talk to students on the way in
Pre-teaching words (or keeping a list throughout class) - vocabulary
Choral reading - or singing

#### **Breakout Room 2**

#### **Classroom Routines:**

- Ask the students how they are feeling.
- Go through the Gogyup
- Use some reading activities
- Open the class up for questions at times to let the students clarify any confusion
- Go back over the slides and repeat key vocab words and points to work on pronunciation/ understanding
- When a student makes a simple grammar/pronunciation mistake, repeat the phrase with the correct grammar without specifically calling out the error.

#### **Breakout Room 3**

## **Classroom Routines**:

- A question of the day that is a light introduction to the topic.
- As they enter, draw out some element of their life, for a casual intro.
- Pull something from the curriculum earlier in the week to ask questions.
- Introduce a common phrase that is an instant win that you can use right away, like "I am going to...." or another simple model.
- "Would you rather?" questions later in the term.
- Have one student ask the next person the modeled question, to have a successful interaction.
- "Secrets of English": introduce collected concepts that knock out a lot of exceptions/challenges at once.
- Second pass through flash card slides for spelling.
- Create a scenario in a store, store owner (teacher) doesn't speak Spanish, the customer (co-teacher) doesn't speak English and the students translate between them.

#### **Breakout Room 4**

## **Classroom Routines:**

- Welcoming/greeting each student
- Having a game/buffer activity for arriving students
- Having something students write so they actually have something to take home for the day
- Being open about expectations
- Encouraging students to bring questions
- Making classes work for students!

#### **Breakout Room 5**

### Classroom Routines:

- Share what my weekend was like, ask them to share what their weekend was like
- One on one engagement as students enter the classroom
- Have students talk to each other about how they are
- Use spotlight Zoom tool, and drawing functions in powerpoint
- Use textbox to highlight new words
- Refer to the Gogyup app reading and encourage them to ask about vocabulary
- Use a class roster, divide large classes into subgroups, for large classes
- People on sticks/puppets
- Use a word bank to work together to make a story

## Task 3: Classroom Solutions & Strategies

# Discuss what you do if:

- you run out of slides/things to teach
- students aren't participating
- other problems arise
- Report back on your solutions and strategies for confronting these issues.

#### **Breakout Room 1**

# Classroom Solutions & Strategies:

Review next day's gogy-app to prepare

Games: hangman (space man), telephone game, etc

Keep track of number of slides and save enough for second half

Co-teacher, follow along on the slides in case of lost internet

## **Breakout Room 2**

# **Classroom Solutions & Strategies:**

- -Hang man "Space Man!"
- -Draw out an activity, like role playing
- -Use white board to co-create a picture or a story using vocab
- -Give students vocab and ask them write their own stories, share and communicate with other students (informal practice, don't focus on grammar)
- -"Password"

#### **Breakout Room 3**

# **Classroom Solutions & Strategies:**

- We also play Word Man! And other games, like Family Feud!
- Write a few sentences on the topic
- We take another pass through the flashcards with a different focus: pronunciation or **spelling**

#### **Breakout Room 4**

# Classroom Solutions & Strategies:

- Go back to slides and do more activities with them
- Charades!
- Spend a long time doing review, grammar, questions etc. at the end
- Have students ask each other questions
- If there's a new teacher/sub, play a game of "ask your teacher" for introductions
- Use the whiteboard
- Read the Gogyup for other levels as a practice
- Asking lots of questions about one student's answer to get them engaged
- Acknowledge new students and catch them up so they feel included
- Some students can't be very engaged b/c they're doing other things, but make them feel welcome and included!
- Choral reading

#### **Breakout Room 5**

## Classroom Solutions & Strategies:

- Go back and review highlights of the class
- What is your favorite food, sport, activity?
- Open questions about what students would like to know
- Use the Oxford Picture Dictionary Spanish English for ideas
- Use the whiteboard to list out words
- Ask the students what they learned, how they felt about the class, and ask for

their feedback
