Ways to help

Have a donation drive:

- Dry Cat and Dog food without Red Dye
- Non-clumping clay cat litter
- KMR Milk replacer for kittens
- Dog toys without squeakers and Kongs
- Hard and Soft Dog and Cat treats

Create a Fundraiser:

- Penny Drive: Ask the students in your school to bring in spare change and donate it to the shelter
 - Bake Sale: Everyone loves a sweet treat and it's even better when the proceeds go to a good cause.
 - Car Wash: Get permission to use your school's parking lot. Post adds in your town to spread the word.
 - Host an Art Show and donate proceeds from ticket sales to a good cause
 - Have a Lemonade Stand

Create Enrichment Items for the Animals

- Make dog biscuit sandwiches use 2 medium dog biscuits and spread peanut butter between them making a sandwich (small amount)
 - Make cat toys
 - Plastic straws tied into a loose knot
 - Old socks with a little catnip folded onto itself
 - o Dollar store cat toy 'bells' tied to a piece of yarn
 - Yarn balls about the size of a golf ball.
 - Stuffy toys for cats for those that SEW- 6 inch square fabric stuffed and catnip then top/bottom sewed
