

Essay Final Draft Revision Reflection

The most important part of your learning process consists of the ability to self-reflect about your writing. This form of thinking, called metacognition, helps students to grow as writers.

Instructions: Answer each question thoughtfully and thoroughly. You must be able to describe the feedback you received and the choices you made about revision in order to demonstrate learning and care about your work.

1. What was the primary feedback you received from your professor during your conference, from SpeedGrader (Canvas comments)?
2. What feedback did you receive from your tutor during your appointment (conventions to fix, details to add/remove, areas to reorganize, etc.)?
3. How was the peer editing process helpful? What suggestions did your classmates make to help you improve your essay?
4. What changes did you make from your first draft to your final draft? Please be *specific*: give me page numbers, and paragraph numbers, or refer to specific conventions, and tell me exactly how you made revisions.
5. If you chose not to make a revision, please explain your rationale for making this choice.
6. What grade do you think you deserve for this essay. Tell why.
7. Specifically reflect upon your writing for this essay. In what ways have you improved as a writer? Do you have any new goals for yourself?
