## ***Handout for SMILE Video Project***

SMILE Video Project  
(SMILE: Student-Made Inquiry-based Learning Experience)  
ENGL 3241 - Dr. Moran

For this project, you will team up with two or three other students and create a video based on your inquiry into an aspect of *Eleanor & Park*. Your final video will be posted on EdPuzzle, and you will evaluate your peers based on their responses to your video and your questions.

### What to do:

- 1 LIST: Brainstorm a list of things you want to know about *Eleanor & Park*. These can be related to setting, characters, theme, music, cars, or any other aspect of the novel that interests you. Save this list as a Google Doc and share with Dr. Moran.
- 2 INVESTIGATE: Decide which item you all want to know more about. Launch an inquiry into this item. Investigate it through the Internet, as well as our library databases. Write notes on your findings. Save the notes as a Google Doc and share with Dr. Moran
- 3 PLAN: Based on your findings, create a storyboard on the storyboard template. This will be the overall plan for your video. You can detail shots here, if you like. Share the storyboard in your Google Drive folder.
- 4 SCRIPT: Write a script for the video. This is what you will read, or talk from, in the video. Plan here for any insertions of other media content (like film clips or still photos). Save the script and put in your Google Drive folder.
- 5 SHOOT: Shoot or record the video. This may take several tries. If you are adding in extra content, then you will need to upload the video into an editing program, such as iMovie or Windows MovieMaker. Your final video cannot be longer than 5 minutes.
- 6 UPLOAD: Upload the finished movie into EdPuzzle. Insert at least THREE questions.
- 7 SHARE: Share the finished EdPuzzle link with the class.
- 8 ASSESS: Gather the data as it comes in and assess the class' responses to your video.
- 9 REFLECT: Write a one-page reflection on the inquiry process of creating the video and how you might use a similar idea in your own class.
- 10 CELEBRATE!
