- Hello, GCPC! I have a gripe for your next Cacher Coffee or Adventure Lab episode. I currently have 6 active ALs in New Jersey. My biggest gripe:
 Statistics! As the CO of ALs, it's difficult to gauge recent activity on an AL. About a year & Damp; a half ago, I noticed the frequency of Reviews on

newly-completed ALs in my area had dropped quite sharply. Reviews had been my primary method to gauge activity on my ALs, since most of mine do not have a bonus cache.

•

• I have access to Statistics of my ALs. Yes, the Statistics has a total count for the AL's # of Locations Found & Damp; # of Activities Completed; but with 6 active ALs, those total counts are not useful if I can't remember their change from, let's say, a month ago. The Statistics includes a list of the First 10 To Complete -- insightful! But once an AL has more than 10 completions, I can't use that list to gauge new activity.

•

 My workaround: The Description for each of my ALs now has text stating: " As of [a certain date], X Locations & Description with the current totals, noting in my head the change from the previous totals.

• This workaround would not be needed if the Statistics for an AL simply showed a monthly total of # of Locations Found & December 2 amp; # of Adventures Completed.

 I would think that other Adventure Lab COs would want such visibility into their own ALs -- Right?
