INTRODUCTION

Explaining the research background and discussing here previous studies of research relations with other researchers, especially in the works of relevant

academics. Another thing that needs to be disclosed here is the importance of the purpose of the research you are doing and what your contribution is.

RESEARCH METHODS

Explain the type of research, data sources, data collection methods, data analysis and others. Example: this research is library research. Library research is research carried out using library literature, either in the form of books, notes, or reports on the results of previous research (Hasan, 2008: 5).

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

Study and analyze each aspect of the problem one by one. It is necessary to build arguments and analyze the data discussed and compared with other research and scholarly works. In other words, the way to address an issue here is to combine data and discussion. If necessary, include tables, figures, figures or other illustrations. For quotations use the APA (American Psychological Association) style, for example: (Iqbal, 1983: 47). The body note contains the author's last name, year of publication, and page (Edelman, 2015: 6).
