



Privacy Statement

The protection of your privacy including your personal data is of great importance to the European Aikido Federation. When processing personal data we respect the principles of the Charter of Fundamental Rights of the European Union, and in particular the Article 8 on data protection as well the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 (General Data Protection Regulation) (hereinafter "the Regulation").

All data of personal nature - data that can identify you directly or indirectly - is handled with the necessary care and according to the rules above.

Further to Article 12 and Article 13 of this Regulation, the European Aikido Federation provides you, the data subjects, with the following information:

- The controller is the European Aikido Federation.

- The purpose of the data processing is to set up, manage and maintain a database of aikido instructors to enable the European Aikido Federation to issue or update (a) certificate(s) to instructors of the member associations in order to increase trust, and credibility and to foster cooperation among European aikido instructors and to facilitate students access to quality teaching. The data may be further used for preparing statistics, analytics, communication, and knowledge sharing.
- The categories of data collected and used for the processing operations are:
 - first name, family name, date of birth, gender, nationality,

- e-mail address, phone number,
 - aikido grade and title, aikido federation, aikido dojo
- The recipients of the data are:
 - the members of the board of the European Aikido Federation
 - the executive team of the European Aikido Federation
 - organiser of specific project or event, on ad hoc, need-to-know basis

You have the right of access to your data and the right to rectify your data and the right to ask for eraser of your data. If you wish to do so, please contact the Data Protection Officer of the EAF: dpo@aikido.eu-org.

- The legal basis of the processing operation at stake is consent. This consent should be freely given and can be revoked at any time.
- The personal data will be kept for 5 years. Before this period ends, the EAF will ask the data subject for their consent to continue to store the data for an additional 5 years.
- Anyone whose personal data is processed have the right to have recourse at any time to the DPO dpo@aikido.eu-org and to the Netherlands Data Protection Surveillance Authority ([Autoriteit Persoonsgegevens](#)).
