Bradman's Iconic Bat from 1934



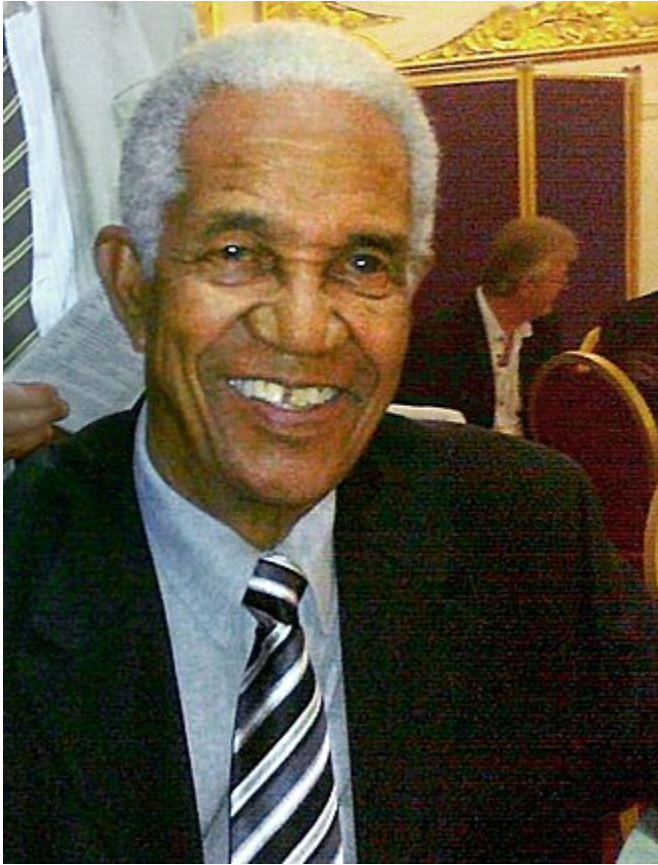

[Bradman](#) blasted his way to a record-breaking 974 runs in the 5 test series with an average of 139.14. His powerful stroke play and calm temperament under pressure shattered England's bowling. Central to his dominance was the slender bat he wielded throughout the 1934 Ashes. Crafted from the finest Kashmir willow, this bat helped Bradman carve history.

Sold for Over 300,000 Australian Dollars

In November 2020, Bradman's iconic 1934 Ashes bat was auctioned for a record Australian dollars. Given its historical significance, the price tag was no surprise. Any piece of equipment used by the greatest batsman ever in one of his greatest series commands a premium. Those lucky enough to own a memento of Bradman's dominance hold a little piece of cricket immortality in their hands.

Gary Sobers - A Cricketing Giant



Sir [Garfield Sobers](#) is considered by many as the greatest all-rounder to have graced the game of cricket. The Bat From 1968

On the subsequent tours to India and Australia too, the bat helped him pile on the runs.

Over 50 years later, Sobers' iconic 1968 bat still retains a sheen reminiscent of his golden era. A classy piece crafted from the finest willow, it brings to life the effortless grace and power of one cricket's undisputed greats during his peak.
