

Ceramics/Sculpture I and II Major Instructional Goals

Course Descriptions

- <u>Ceramics/Sculpture I:</u> This course concentrates on the study of three-dimensional materials and concepts including basic techniques of hand-building, throwing and glazing of clay.
- <u>Ceramics/Sculpture II:</u> This course continues the development of three-dimensional design in clay. Using historical perspective, this class will place greater emphasis on form and function. Prerequisite: Successful completion of Ceramics I. Materials fee. This class may be repeated for credit.
