14) Roundtable / Open Business

- a) Playground Renovation
 - i) Rick from NuToys Leisure Products
 - ii) Installed 25 years ago, made some safety updates
 - iii) Suggestion is to focus on one playground at a time vs. all three at once
 - 1) Can move existing structures from the back playground and move to the front or smaller back playground
 - 2) Front swings; could be painted to last a few more years
 - 3) Could also leave posts and platforms and replace or add on new pieces
 - 4) Not a lot of space in the front
 - iv) Bigger back playground proposals based on budget provided (5-12 year olds)
 - v) Swings should be in back of playground for safety
 - vi) Option 1
 - 1) Modular structure in the center
 - 2) All increments in 8 inches for children and accessibility
 - 3) Want multiple ways up and multiple ways down
 - 4) 4 ft, 6ft (swoosh slide, 8ft slides
 - 5) Monkey bars, rock wall, surf rocker

- 6) 3 independent units over budget, could be added later; we have some that could remain
- vii) Option 2
 - 1) Friendship swing
 - 2) Increased side of swoosh slide to 8 ft
 - 3) Portal net climber between platforms
 - 4) Independent spinners
- viii) Option 3
 - 1) Portal climber
 - 2) 6 foot swoosh slide
 - 3) Net climbing wall
 - 4) Turbo twister stand on twister for multiple kids to stand on
- ix) Consider options for accessibility
 - 1) We have a molded swing already we could swap in
 - 2) There can be activity panels at ground levels
- x) Smaller back playground has 2 items that (ring and trapeze) that can easily be replaced; everything is interchangeable and will fit to the existing pieces
- xi) Goal is spring break renovation
- xii) All PTO money, no district fundraising
 - 1) Kyle asked district and was told it's how it's been
- xiii) Volunteer Install
 - 1) 1 day with the right people
 - 2) Can provide a supervisor to dig the holes this is the hardest part; about \$2k
- xiv) Timing
 - 1) Lead time of 3-4 months
 - 2) Need a dumpster
 - 3) Kyle can get a Flood Brothers dumpster donated
 - 4) Children around the world will take old structures and paint and send off to a new place saw everything and take up footings (34 inches) Rick will call and ask them tomorrow Kids Around the World not interested coming to get old structure (10/31/23 LKO)
- b) Vote to approve additional funds to playground budget
 - i) Starting budget is \$50-\$60k
 - ii) Can add more to the budget, approximately \$20k
 - iii) Want to: redo large back playground, \$2k into small back playground, improve front playground with swapping
 - iv) Committee to meet within 2 weeks to vote and submit decision may ask student input
