Science

This week in Science students completed their half-termly assessments. Previously students only did formal assessments once a term but in preparation for regular half-termly assessments next year we have now started this in science also. Your child should be able to tell you their score by half term. For clarity, I want to mention that the 'current level' that you will see on the reports is from the assessments the students did at easter. We also started studying voltage, with students looking at models to help them visualise how it works in a circuit. Special mention to Emmanuel Oladeru and Mary Jeng (both MJ) who came up with their own model and went on to evaluate how realistic it is. This is level 7 work and they should be proud of their effort. Next week students will finish the half term by studying combustion, more voltage and digestive organs.
