

Toolkit: Eradicating Native Mascots in Sports after the Washington Football Team Name Retirement

As a direct result of over five decades of Native-led advocacy and some 15 years of shareholder engagement by Native and social investors, [the Washington Football Team retired its racist name and logo](#) on July 13, 2020.

Critical action remains following this important achievement for fair and equitable representation of Native people in the U.S.:

- Ensure Washington's new name and logo are free of all Native associations.
- Engage other problematic sports franchises, including teams in [Kansas City](#), [Atlanta](#), [Chicago](#), and [Exeter](#), as well as college teams and [more than 1,900 K-12 schools in the U.S.](#)
- Where names and logos have been retired, facilitate reparative and reconciliatory action by the teams and their fans, inclusive of Native peoples and communities.
- Advocate for change wherever there is questionable or harmful representation of Native peoples and culture in business, industry and society.



Action continues on all fronts to eliminate mascots and logos throughout sports that are racist and appropriative of Native American people and culture, including Native-led and investor-led initiatives:

- ✓ [National Congress of American Indians](#) and [IllumiNative](#) continue to engage with teams and fans, uplifting the lifework of such individuals as [Suzan Shown Harjo](#) and [Amanda Blackhorse](#). In 2020, Harjo and Blackhorse were leaders of [a statement to the NFL signed by 1400 Native American advocates and organizations](#), asking to **cease the use of racialized Native American branding by eliminating all imagery evocative of Native American culture, traditions, and spirituality from team franchises**, and to end the use of Native terms, feathers, arrows, or monikers that assume the presence of Native American culture.
- ✓ The [Investors & Indigenous Peoples Working Group](#), which [led a campaign by investors worth \\$230 billion](#) in June 2020 to demand the Washington Football Team name retirement, also engaged around the Kansas City Team's 2021 Super Bowl playoff with letters to [Nike](#), [PepsiCo](#), and [retailers](#) (notably, Amazon, Walmart, Dick's Sporting Goods, and Target [were among the first retailers](#) to remove merchandise brandishing the Washington Team's racist name and logo.)
- ✓ Decisive action from teams, retailers and sponsors, and [growing support from sports fans](#) continues to make waves across North America, such as [Cleveland](#) and [Edmonton](#) team name changes; legislation to ban Native-themed mascots in [Colorado](#), [Nevada](#) and [Washington](#), as well as [budgetary restrictions in Connecticut](#); and over 100 K-12 [schools in the U.S.](#) dropping or considering to drop racist names and mascots since the WFT name retirement.

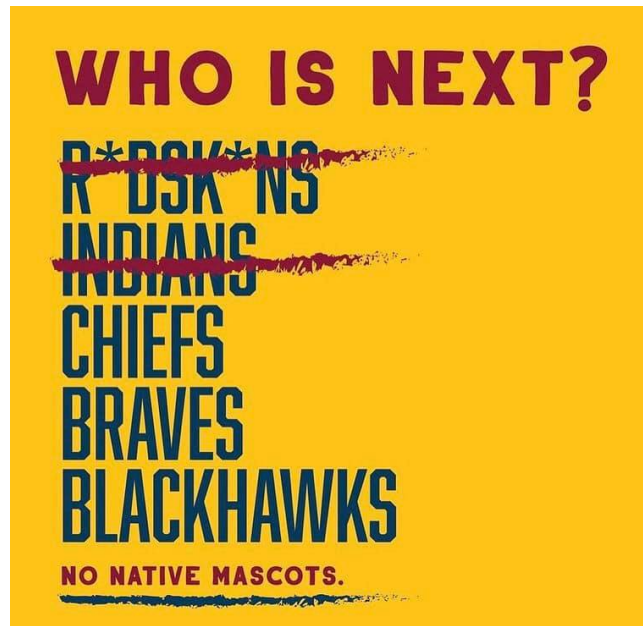

- Next steps to eradicate all Native mascots, logos and names in sports:
 - ✓ Advocate for change to all questionable or harmful representation of Native peoples and culture throughout industry and society
 - ✓ Demand sports franchises @Chiefs @Braves @NHLBlackhawks @ExeterChiefs [#ChangeTheName](#) and drop the mascot
 - ✓ Work to change the racist names and mascots of some 1,900 U.S. schools
 - ✓ Ensure new team names/logos are free of all Native associations
 - ✓ Facilitate reparative and reconciliatory action by the teams and fans inclusive of Native peoples and communities
 - ✓ Uplift Native voices and concerns, and elevate frontline Native communities and organizations

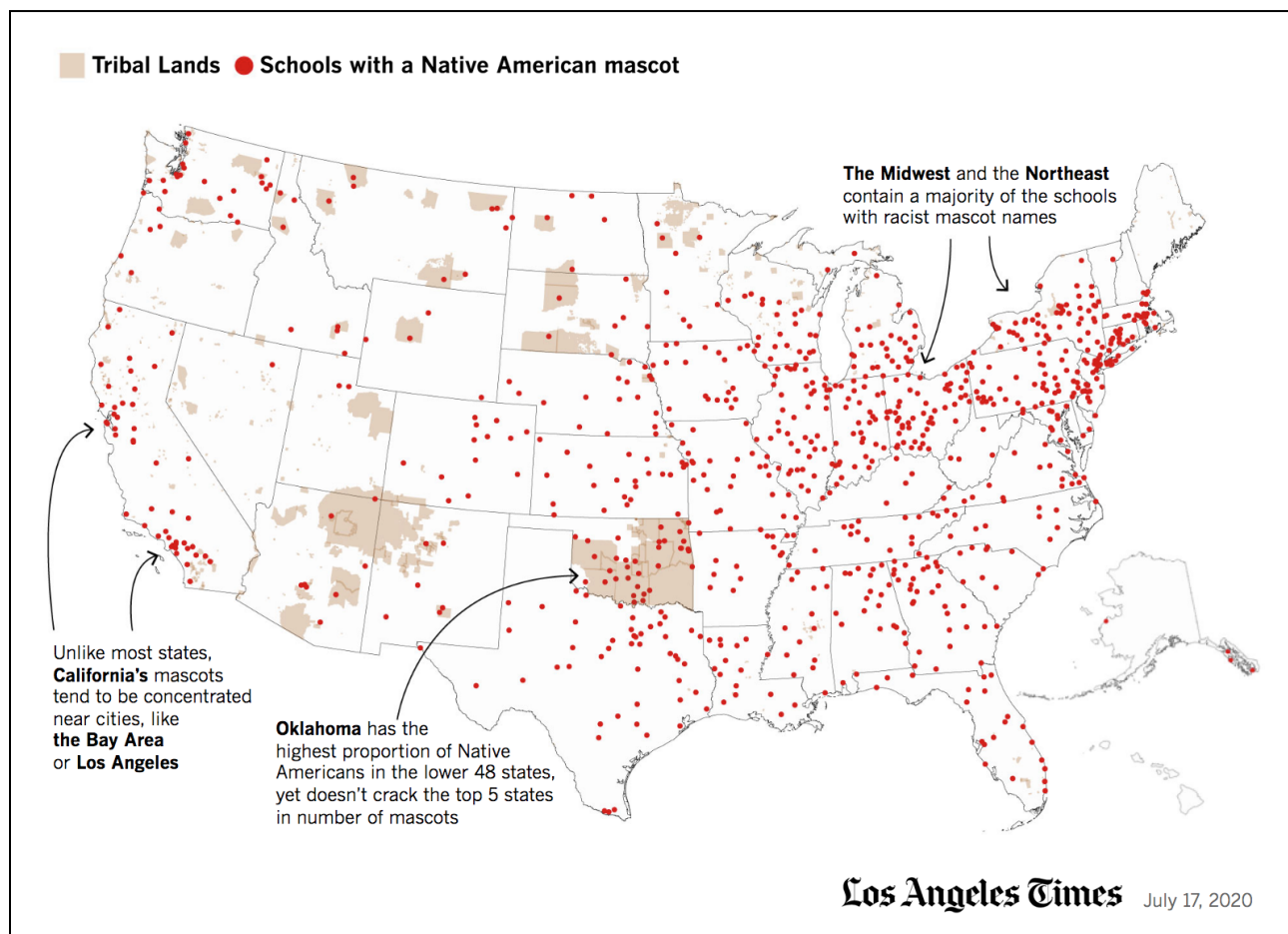
