

# ***Room 9 Spelling Lists***

## ***Setup and use for tests and buddy testing***

Starting term 2, week 5 we will use our spelling lists for:

- Setting up our homework spelling lists
- Preparing words for our spelling tests
- Preparing words for buddy testing

Use these instructions so that you are setting up your spelling list correctly:

1. Make sure you have a new, blank list ready to enter words (don't delete previous weeks!)
2. Copy any words you did not spell correctly from your current week's spelling list.
3. Then, copy any words from spelling tests you may have not answered correctly first.
4. Next, from your writing books, copy words you have corrected during proofreading and editing.
5. Finally if you have any spots leftover use the Rocket Spelling folder with challenging (but not difficult) words to get your list up to ten.
6. To make your job easier add words to the next week's spelling list as you correct words in your writing.

What to do with the spelling list:

- Do not change words during the week. If there are any difficult words Mr Murray will mark it with a comment, or add notes with strategies.
- Get some practice in before your spelling test with Mr Murray. Buddy up with a classmate. Sharing one device, take turns at practicing your words. Write them in the back of your writing book. Remember to date your buddy test and add a **B** in the spelling list doc on the day you both tested.
- On your testing day with Mr Murray you do not need to bring a Chromebook with your spelling list open. He will use his device to update your progress.
