Robert F. Stowe, 65, of Oshkosh, died Saturday in Sheboygan where he was attending a Knight York Cross of Honor assembly.

Bob was born Aug. 15, 1925, in Oshkosh, the son of William J. and Beatrice C. Hewitt Stowe. On June 9, 1945, he married Ruth D. Otto in Greenville, S.C.

Bob was the grand recorder for the Grand Council of Royal & Select Masters of the state of Wisconsin. He was a member of St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Oshkosh, where he was active in the church choir.

He was a Naval veteran of World War II and was a member of the American Legion Cook-Fuller Post No. 70. He was a board member of the Salvation Army.

He was also active in many Masonic organizations: Omro Lodge No. 168, Tyrian Chapter No. 15, Oshkosh Council No. 8, Oshkosh Commandry No. 11, Valley/Green Bay Scottish Rite, Order of Eastern Star Oriental Chapter No. 16, White Shrine of Jerusalem, Zia Grotto and the board of trustees for the Oshkosh Masonic Temple. He was an officer of York Rite North Central College No. 112.

Bob is survived by his wife, Ruth, of Oshkosh; a daughter and son-in-law, Gail (Dave) McNeil of Oshkosh; four brothers and three sisters-in-law: Edward and Ruby Stowe, Thomas Stowe, Willard and Judith Stowe and Larry and Arlene Stowe, all of Oshkosh; a sister and brother-in-law, Lynn and George Cuske of Oshkosh; and several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his parents, three brothers and two sisters.
