

State and Local Seal Descriptions

**Students must complete two seals (one seal has to be a state seal)

State Seals	Description	
Ohio Means Jobs Readiness Seal (OHIO)	 Students will earn the OhioMeansJobs-Readiness Seal by satisfying each of the following: Demonstrate proficiency in each of 14 <u>identified professional skills</u>; Use the <u>OhioMeansJobs-Readiness Seal form</u> to record demonstration of each professional skill; and Work with a mentor to validate demonstration of each skill across a minimum of two of the three environments. The three potential environments are: 1. School, 2. Work, and 3. Community. 	
Seal of Biliteracy (OHIO)	To earn the Ohio Seal of Biliteracy, graduating seniors must demonstrate high levels of proficiency in English and at least one other language. Students will earn the Seal of Biliteracy by satisfying each of the following: 1. Earn a score of proficient or higher on an approved English Language assessment. 2. Earn a score of Intermediate High or higher on an approved World Language Assessment within 15 months before graduation.	
Industry Recognized Credential Seal (OHIO)	An industry-recognized credential is a qualification of a specific set of competencies related to an industry or occupation. These credentials can take many different forms, including certificates, certifications and licenses. To earn Ohio's Industry-Recognized Credential Seal, students must do one of the following: Earn a 12-point industry-recognized credential; or Earn a group of credentials totaling 12 points in a single career field – as outlined here; or Obtain a state-issued license for a practice in a vocation that requires an examination	
College Ready Seal (OHIO)	Earn remediation-free scores on the ACT or start ACT ACT English: 18 (or higher) Math: 22 (or higher)	SAT. SAT Writing/Reading: 480 (or higher) Math: 530 (or higher)
Military Enlistment Seal (OHIO) Military Seal	For students interested in a career pathway that includes serving in a branch of the armed services, the Military Seal is an option to satisfy components of Ohio's graduation requirements. To earn Ohio's Military Seal, students must complete one of the following: 1. Show evidence of enlistment in a branch of the armed services; or 2. Participate in a junior reserve officer training corps (JROTC) program for at least two school years 3. Provide evidence student accepted scholarship to enter the reserve officer training corps; or	

4. Evidence of appointment into a United States military service academy.

Citizenship Seal (OHIO)



To earn Ohio's Citizenship Seal, students must satisfy one of the listed American History options and one of the listed American Government options:

American History options:

- **1.** Earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a "B" or higher in an American History course
- 2. Earn a score of proficient or higher on Ohio's State Test in American History
- 3. Earn a score equivalent to proficient on an appropriate Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate test in US History
- 4.Earn a "B" or higher in appropriate American History College Credit Plus course.

American Government options:

- **1.** Earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a "B" or higher in an American Government course
- 2. Earn a score of proficient or higher on Ohio's State Test in American Government
- 3. Earn a score equivalent to proficient on an appropriate Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate test in US Government
- 4. Earn a "B" or higher in appropriate American Government College Credit Plus course

Science Seal (OHIO)



To earn Ohio's Science Seal, students must satisfy at least one of the following:

- 1. Earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a "B" or higher in an Advanced Science course;
- 2. Earn a score of proficient on Ohio's State Test in Biology;
- 3. Earn a score equivalent to proficient on an appropriate Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate science test; or
- 4. Earn a "B" or higher in a College Credit Plus science course.

Honors Diploma Seal (OHIO)



Earn one of six Honors Diplomas outlined below:

- 1. Academic Honor Diploma
- 2. International Baccalaureate Honors Diploma
- 3. Career-Tech Honors Diploma
- 4. STEM Honors Diploma
- 5. Arts Honors Diploma
- 6. Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma

Technology Seal (OHIO)



To earn Ohio's Technology Seal, students must satisfy at least one of the requirements below:

- 1. Earn a score equivalent to proficient on an appropriate Advanced Placement or International Baccalaureate test; or
- 2. Earn a "B" or higher in an appropriate College Credit Plus technology course; or
- 3. Complete a technology course that meets criteria established by the Ohio Department of Education (below).

Local Seals	Description	
Community Service Seal (Western Brown)	 To earn the Community Service Seal, a student must create and complete a community service project(s) aligned to the guidelines listed below: Have the project approved by the school counselor (complete proposal form linked below). Students must have 20 hours of community service in their four years of high school. Complete an hours log with supervisor signatures. Supervisors cannot be relatives. Hours must be outside of a school day (but can be connected to a school club/organization/group project). Provide picture/video documentation of student actively working. Complete reflection questions based on what was learned by the service. Pre-approval and Tracking/Signature Forms can be obtained in the school counseling office or here. Once the requirements for the seal have been met, the form should be turned in to the school counselor. 	
Fine Arts Seal (Western Brown)	Students can earn a Fine Arts Seal by participating in 2 high school credits in the fine and/or performing arts. - See courses under ART and MUSIC in the Course Description Booklet for a list of credits that count for this seal. - Fine Arts credits earned through College Credit Plus or transferred from other high schools also qualify.	
Student Engagement Seal (Western Brown)	To earn the Student Engagement Seal, a student must participate in WBHS extracurricular activities to a meaningful extent. Meaning extent is defined as: participation and successful completion of two activities (clubs or athletics) during high school. Tracking/Signature Forms can be obtained in the school counseling office or here . Once the requirements for the seal have been met, the form should be turned in to the school counselor.
