Where We've Been

Last week, we read the fairy tale "The Three Little Pigs." We enjoyed reading different versions of the tale, comparing versions, and talking about story elements (character, setting, problem, solution). We also learned some facts about real pigs and compared them to the Three Little Pigs!

In Fundations, we learned when to use c (followed by a, o, or u) and when to use k (followed by e or i)!

In Math, we learned about equal and not equal, comparing shapes, and continued to play with teen numbers. We also took our Unit 3 Post test to see how much we've learned through this unit.

In Writing Workshop, we had some good laughs checking to see if our stories made sense (pulling eyes out of heads, building trucks with no wheels, and putting peanut butter jars on bread:)).

A special thanks to Mr. Richmond for letting us visit his

Maple Syrup Shack. This year's batch is extra sweet! We learned how they get it from the trees, boil it, and make syrup!

Where We Are Going

This week we will continue our Fairy Tale theme. We will read some other versions of "The Three Little Pigs" while also reading "Goldilock's and the Three Bears."

In Fundations, we will continue to practice tapping to read and tapping to spell. We will review when to use c or k. We also intertwine using long vowels (specifically Super E) when reading or spelling words.

In Math, we will be reviewing subtraction.

In Writing Workshop, we will continue to write how-to stories. Our focus this week will be on adding labels to our diagrams to help readers understand our stories.
