Message From The Board

Your Cougar Gulch board members met on November 6th, 2025 to discuss the needs of the hall and our community. We have also scheduled some new fun events for the months ahead.

What's happening at the hall-

Roof Repairs- Our President Jonelle Greear reported that the repairs to the roof vent and fan installation have been completed. The insulation was completed on October 7th which should conclude this project. Some minor clean up of the interior water stains are still needed. The total repair cost came to around \$3,000.

Kitchen Refresh & Storage- Jonelle led a discussion on which project should become our next priority, the kitchen refresh, or storage. Solving the storage issue for the tables and chairs will give us more space in the kitchen area which may impact the final kitchen refresh design. Dawn Myers volunteered to lead the kitchen refresh project and will be preparing new design ideas for the kitchen. Jonelle will be contacting a contractor to

consult on possible solutions for the storage of the tables and chairs. Discussion also included the possible donation of the items needed for the kitchen refresh, i.e. cabinets and appliances.

Wood- Jonelle will be organizing a cut & split wood splitting time before winter.

Snowplow & additional snow removal-

A contract for 2025/2026 snowplow removal has been renewed, as well as additional snow removal for the pathways and steps.

Membership changes in effect-Reminder, changes to our membership are now in effect as of January 1st, 2025. The non-member rental fee is now \$300, if they join the hall at time of rental, their fee will be \$150. The new member rental fee is \$150, and our senior members, meaning members in good standing, paying dues by April 1st, for the past 2 consecutive years will get a discounted rate of \$75. Our membership fee is \$25 if paid by April 1st, and \$30 if paid after for the calendar year. You can also purchase a lifetime membership for a one time fee of \$250. Memberships can be purchased online through our website.
