# News from the Secondary School College Admissions Counselor

Hello Parents!

I hope you all enjoyed a nice holiday break! Breaks are a great time to get away from the stresses of school and instead, spend time with friends and family. It's always important to take time to destress and focus on other aspects of life that are important! Now that we're back in school, the year is going to keep moving faster and faster! Many of our senior's US university applications were submitted just before the break, and I know they are eagerly awaiting (hopefully good) news about their applications! Please remind them to relax, continue focusing on school, and let the chips fall where they may, as the expression goes. They have put in 3+ years of hard

work in high school so I sincerely hope for the best for all of them!

As we begin to focus on the end of the 1st semester (January 28), midterms exams become front and center. For our freshmen, this will be their first time taking such exams. Here are a few tips to help your children prepare for these tests:

- 1) Don't wait until the day or even week before a test to start reviewing. Plan several study sessions over the course of several days or weeks. This way students won't have to 'cram' material.
- 2) Encourage your child to talk with their teachers in the days and weeks leading up to their tests so that there are no surprises on test day. Students should ask for clarity if they are unsure about what content will be on their exams or what the format of the test might be.
- 3) Students should go to teachers for extra support during PLT class. This is a perfect time to get questions answered and to prepare for exams with the people that are giving them!
- 4) Keep checking PlusPortals regularly and make sure there are no missing assignments. Missing assignments will always hurt a student's grade. If a teacher will allow a student to turn in an assignment late for partial credit, they should do that. Partial credit is always better than zero credit.
- 5) Get plenty of sleep. Getting 8-10 hours of sleep, though challenging at times, has shown to be an effective way to maximize focus and concentration, reduce stress, improve immune system function, among many other benefits.
- 6) Eat a healthy breakfast. By doing this, students will gain essential nutrients that help provide energy, improve alertness, mental performance, concentration, mood, and memory.

## UNIT OF STUDY




## READING

## WRITING

## VOCABULARY





Wonder has a long list of vocabulary words that will be new to all students. Reading supports learning new words. However, students can improve remembering these new words by taking notes or applying the dictionary activities that we have practiced all semester. I provided students with a word list of academic vocabulary words. Students do not need to study this list. Instead, they can use it to check on how many academic English vocabulary words they know, As students continue to read for at least 30 minutes every day, they will see their Lexile scores increase which is also an indicator of how large their English vocabulary is.

## **GRAMMAR**

Students can write Chinese descriptions of scenic spots according to the pictures.





## Computer Policy for 2021-22

#### Student Computers - 2021-22

The Faculty and Administration believe technology is a powerful and integral part of the TCIS instructional program. While there are many good computers on the market, please understand PC/Windows based computers are not supported for academics at TCIS.

1) TCIS Secondary School is a MacBook/IPad one-to-one school - MacBooks or IPads are required for all grade 7 through 12 students



- 2) TCIS Grades 5 & 6
  - a) School owned Chromebooks are provided for grades 5 & 6 students.
  - b) All students in Grades 5-6 need access to a computer at their home. Students will be using Google Classroom and various websites for school work. We do recommend a laptop but any computer for home use is fine. iPads and tables are acceptable but have some limitations. Windows-based computers are fine for home use as well but are not allowed on the school network.
  - c) Grade 5 & 6 students can opt out of the school owned Chromebooks if they have their own MacBook or IPad.
    - i) IPads are more durable for Grade 5 & 6 students and are recommended.
- 3) TCIS Elementary School
  - a) School owned technology is provided for elementary students





### Middle School Math Pathways

For math in middle school, we offer Pre-Algebra in Grade 7. In order to move to Algebra 1 in Grade 8 students must score 80% or higher in both Semesters. Alternatively, students can be placed in Algebra 1 in Grade 8 if they score 70-79% for a class average and pass a cumulative exam with a mark of 80% or above. Any Grade 7 student who does not meet these conditions must take Pre-Algebra Part 2 in Grade 8. For Grade 6, any student who does not have 80% or above for a yearly average will take Pre-Algebra Part 1 in Grade 7 and Pre-Algebra Part 2 in Grade 8.

## Hair Color Requirement at the TCIS

It is a requirement that students at the TCIS maintain their natural hair color. Other colors (including highlights, shading, etc.) are not acceptable. While students enjoy trying new things in Secondary School, hair color is not one of those things that we allow students to experiment with.

Section 5.4-2 (page 29) of the Student Parent Handbook (Uniform and Appearance) regarding hair color:

Hairstyles, if considered inappropriate for students in a school setting, will not be allowed. Hair, even if colored, should be of natural hair color or hue.

Hair Styles Not Permitted at TCIS for Students from PK2 to Grade 12

Images such as lightning bolts are not shaved into a student's hair.(Example: Image 1) **Hair must be kept as the student's natural color.** Dyed, highlighted, bleached, or colored hair is not permitted at TCIS. (Examples: Images 2 & 3)







Parents/visitors who wish to enter campus are asked to schedule an appointment through the registrar.

- Masks must be worn at all times, including the classroom.
- Students' temperature is checked upon entrance.
- Late students must check in <u>with the Registrar</u> to receive an "Admit to Class" slip. The registrar is located in the main lobby of the admin building.
- Students must use hand-sanitizer before entering school and before entering each classroom.
- Students must sanitize any shared classroom materials/supplies after each use.
- Students sanitize their desks before leaving from every class, with the provided supplies.
- Students must remain socially distant at all times.
- No more than 4 students in the restroom at any given time.
- Students may take their backpacks into their classroom for each block to avoid groups at the lockers.
- MS Students have a 20 minute transition period between classes.
- Students may wear a face shield <u>as well as a mask</u> but not instead of a mask.
- Lunch (Students' temperature is checked upon entrance to the canteen before lunch.



Students in grades 5-8 use the Accelerated Reader program to track their reading comprehension skills and obtain points based on the books they read each quarter. Accelerated Reader is a software tool that allows students to select their own book and then assess whether a student has completed reading the book by asking a

series of questions. We keep track of this each quarter and have a big party at the end of the year.

Accelerated Reader is administered by the English Department under the direction of Mr. Ted, our Curriculum Coordinator and Head of English. Students in each grade are required to read independent novels and get points each quarter.



# T.R.A.A.P. METHOD

## TIMELINESS

When was the information published or updated? Does your topic require current information?





## RELEVANCE

Does the information answer your main question? Does the information meet the stated requirements for the assignment?



## AUTHORITY

Who is the author? What are the author's credentials? Is the author affiliated with an educational institution or other organization? Do other books cite the author?



## ACCURACY

Are there statements you know to be false? What citations or references support the author's claim? What do other people have to say about the topic?



### PURPOSE

Is the author's purpose to sell, persuade, entertain, or inform? Is there an obvious bias? Are other points of view expressed?

#### **Excused Absences**

For an Absence to be Excused, a parent must email/call in the absence within 24 hours. The reason for the absence must be supported by the factors outlined in the attendance policy:

- Illness with medical documentation
- observation or celebration of a religious holiday
- recovery from accident with medical documentation
- required court attendance with court notice
- death in the family
- other absences that may be deemed acceptable by the Head of Schools or Designee

If a parent does not email/call in the absence, the student is marked as absent without excuse.

#### **Birthday Cupcake Procedures and No Food Deliveries Policy**



At TCIS, we understand that children and parents wish to celebrate birthdays with classmates. It is a big day! While we do allow children to bring in cupcakes to share with classmates, we do have procedures in place that need to be followed.

Please note, no soda, no full birthday cakes, or candles are allowed, as it takes too much time for us to cut and distribute cake to students and to clean up. Of course, candles are dangerous and present a serious fire risk.

These steps need to be followed:

- The cupcakes must come to school with the student when he/she arrives at school. **Deliveries are not allowed under any circumstances.**
- The cupcake will be given to Ms. Ooy or Dr. Michael in the morning and kept their office
- Do not provide any knives to your child to cut the cupcakes.
- Cupcakes will be distributed only lunch time by the student
- No loss of class instructional time will be allowed due to the celebration

#### No Food Deliveries Allowed

No food deliveries are allowed to TCIS at any time during the school day. If a student forgot his/her lunch, do not worry, we will make sure to take care of them on that day. However, please do make sure your child has money on his/her card to use in the canteen.


