Please leave your dogs at home per the request of QSLB Dressage and the show facility owners.

Insurance/Liability

Competitors are responsible for all insurance covering themselves, employees, owners, and horses, etc. All owners are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance to provide full coverage for participation in equestrian events and to keep the policy up to date. (or to ensure that their provincial memberships, such as Ontario Equestrian (OE), provide such insurance in such situations).

QSLB, show organizers and facility owners take no responsibility for any loss, theft, or damage to any equipment.

Liability waiver must be completed/signed and uploaded with the entries for each show.

Vaccinations

Proof of Equine Vaccinations (Equine influenza and Equine Herpes Virus) per Equestrian Canada General Regulations Article A519, Vaccinations.

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within 6 months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the event.

Proof of vaccination must be uploaded with the show entry to complete the entry.

If your horse is sick or you suspect they may be sick, please contact QSLB and withdraw your entry.

Equestrian Canada Regulations

The Quinte St Lawrence Branch Dressage (QSLB) competitions are sanctioned as a Gold, Silver or Bronze competition member of Equestrian Canada (EC) c/o House of Sport, 2451 Riverside Dr. Ottawa, Ontario, K1H 7X7 and is governed by the rules of EC. (A602.1)

- A602.2: Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book
- A602.4: All Canadian Entries are required to hold an EC Horse Recording, with the exception of Bronze, and have paid the Horse Recording annual activation fee to compete. Foreign entries must sign an affidavit. See A404.
- A602.5: Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location
- A602.6: Any athlete entered in any class at a competition may be selected for human anti-doping as outlined in the Canadian Anti-Doping Program (CADP). Please see EC General Regulations Section A - Appendix A1, Policy On Human Medications for details.
- A602.7: Per A801, every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider and horse shall be subject to the EC constitution and all rules of EC and any additional rules set by the competition. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and the applicable rules of EC and the additional rules, if any, imposed by the competition. Do not participate in this ECsanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the competition.
- A602.8: All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations
- A602.9: When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
- A801.5,6, Glossary. The Person(s) responsible (PR) for a horse must be an adult who has, or shares responsibility for the care, training, custody, and performance of the horse and who has official responsibility for that horse under EC Rules. The PR is liable under the penalty provisions of the applicable EC Rules for any rule violations. Every entry form for an EC sanctioned competition must identify the PR and be signed by the PR. The Person(s) responsible is ultimately responsible for the condition, fitness and management of the horse and is alone responsible for any act performed by himself/herself or by any other person with authorized access to the horse in the stables, elsewhere on the grounds, or while the horse is being ridden, driven or exercised. PR must be an EC Sport Licence holder in good standing OR in the case of junior/minor owner entries, a parent/guardian is entitled to sign as PR. For adult entries into EC sanctioned competitions the PR shall be either the trainer, the owner of the horse or the competitor who rides or drives the horse during the EC sanctioned competition. For Junior entries into EC sanctioned competitions the Junior competitor cannot be the PR. For Junior entries the PR may be either the trainer, the owner of the

horse, or a parent/guardian of the Junior competitor

- Only parents/legal guardians may sign the liability waiver form on behalf of a minor child. Trainers, coaches, agents, etc. may no longer sign this form. **In the case of junior entries, parents or guardians are entitled to sign their children's entry form without holding an EC Sport License, provided they agree to abide by the rules and penalties contained in the Rule Book. (See A214.2).**
- For freestyles, the rider must provide the show organizer with a copy of their freestyle music. You must contact the show organizer prior to the date of the show with your music format to ensure proper equipment will be available.
- A Horse/Rider combination may compete in a maximum of two consecutive test levels and a maximum of three tests a day for levels up to and including second level. Horses competing at third level and higher are restricted to two tests a day maximum.
- All horses including Hors concours and non-competing horses must have a competition number attached and visible at all times while at the event location.
- ALL riders, owners, and coaches must hold at minimum a Bronze Sport Licence (exceptions only in A213)
- Single Event Upgrades are available for purchase directly through the competitors MyEC portal. There is a flat rate of \$55 per upgrade, regardless of levels being upgraded. Upgrades are not available for Platinum.
- Competitions are not to administer these purchases directly. All competitors/owners/coaches who do not have the appropriate level of licence must login to purchase the upgrade before competing at the event.
- A list of licence holders who have purchased upgrades will be available in real time in the Competition Support Portal of the event for validation purposes.
- Please note that allowing individuals to participate without a proper sport licence may result in fines for both the event and the competitor/owner/coach.
- Temporary Horse Recordings will no longer be available for purchase.

Temporary Coach Status

- Temporary Coach Status is now to be purchased directly from EC via the MyEC Portal
- Competitions must ensure all coaches named on entry hold either EC Licenced Coach Status OR have purchased Temporary Coach Status from EC
- Temporary Coach status can be validated via the Competition Support Portal of the event
- This means no more paper forms to be collected from the coach on-site.
- Temporary Coach Status is only available until the end of 2026

Equestrian Canada Statement of Principles | Horse Welfare

- Equestrian Canada (EC) is committed to fostering a safe and inclusive environment for all participants that is free from abuse. The purpose of this Policy is to stress the importance of that commitment by educating Individuals and the public about Horse Abuse, outlining how EC will work to prevent Horse Abuse, and how such Abuse or suspected Abuse can be reported to and addressed by EC.
- EC requires that all Individuals adhere to this Code of Conduct and acknowledge and accept that the welfare of the Horse must always be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.
- Section A Horse Welfare rules apply to all disciplines and all Section Rule Books. Rule exceptions in other Sections that contravene Section A Horse Welfare rules are not permitted and will not be approved.
- EC is committed to:
 - Recognizing horses as sentient beings, defined by the ability to feel, perceive or experience subjectively. (i.e. the animal is not only capable of feeling pain and distress but also can have positive psychological experiences, such as comfort, pleasure or interest that are appropriate to its species, environment and circumstances). To state that animals are sentient accepts that they can experience positive and negative emotions.
 - Upholding the welfare of the Horse, regardless of value and performance level, as the primary priority regardless of competitive commitments, expectations, or commercial influences;
 - Requiring the Horse to be treated with the highest level of care, compassion, respect, and empathy;
 - Requiring that no Horse be subjected to Abuse (ref: Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A General Regulations, Article A517) or Distress;
 - Ensuring that all Individuals accept and implement, at a minimum, the requirements within the National Farm Animal Care Council Equine Code of Practice;
 - Ongoing support for scientific studies of animal-based indicators of pain, Page 2 2026 Rules of Equestrian Canada Section A Distress, and/or compromised welfare;
 - Increasing education and awareness for the evolution of best management and equine husbandry practices;
 - Requiring Individuals to know and follow the EC rules and implement industry regulations in all competitions; and,
 - Reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

Entry Information & Memberships

Entry Submissions

- Only online entries will be accepted through CompeteEasy (<https://www.competeeasy.com>)
- Entry due date is listed under the specific show date, see show date, details and classes offered pages for detailed information for each show.
- Late entries will only be accepted if time permits at the discretion of the show organizer. Late entry fee is \$10.00
- Hors concours entries will be accepted if time permits at the discretion of the show organizer. All fees will apply.
- Non-competing horses, at the sole discretion of the show organizer and approved prior to show date, will be allowed with a completed entry form but must pay the administration fee to receive a number. Rider and owner must have an active OE membership.
- Should the show become over-subscribed prior to the entries closing, QSLB members will be granted preferred entry, after which shows will be filled on a first come basis.
- A Horse/Rider combination may compete in a maximum of two consecutive test levels and a maximum of three tests a day for levels up to and including second level. Horses competing at third level and higher are restricted to two tests a day maximum.
- For classes at the FEI Young Rider, FEI Prix St. George, FEI Intermediate I, FEI Intermediate II, FEI Intermediate A, FEI Intermediate B, FEI Grand Prix U25, FEI Grand Prix levels - a rider/horse combination may compete in a maximum of 1 test per day including the freestyle. In-hand classes are exempt from this rule.
 - Exception: Rider/horse combinations competing in the FEI Young Rider division may compete in an FEI Young Rider Freestyle test in addition to one FEI Young Rider technical test per day.
- A horse may be ridden at two consecutive levels with the same or different riders but may not be entered in the same test with two different riders. A Horse may not compete in more than two consecutive levels at any given competition. Horses may be ridden only once in any class. The horse may not compete against itself, even with a different rider. A maximum of 2 riders may ride the same horse in any given competition, provided the same horse is not entered in the same class.
- Riders will be required to provide their own numbers. Numbers sets are available for purchase onsite.

Refunds & Cancellations

- Refunds/Scratches: There will be NO refunds after the closing date of entries. Before the closing date money will be refunded except the Administration Fee. In the event the competition has to be cancelled, refunds will be given after all expenses to the organizing committee are covered. A horse substitution may be accepted at the discretion of the show organizer, at no extra cost, if sufficient notice is given.
- Show management reserves the right to cancel classes due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents, emergencies. There will be no refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents or emergencies

Limitations

QSLB reserves the right to: limit entries, divide or combine classes and govern all conditions of the competitions, subject to the rules of Equestrian Canada.

Memberships Required

Entrants in all QSLB shows require an active 2026 Ontario Equestrian Membership & Equestrian Canada for both owners/lessee/lessor and competitors.

Horse Recording

Gold/Silver- All Canadian entries are required to hold a valid EC horse recording and have paid EC Horse Recording Annual Activation fee to compete.

QSLB Membership

Memberships run from January 1, 2026 through to December 31, 2026. Joining QSLB will allow you to participate in year-end awards as well as reduced costs for QSLB Shows and QSLB Clinics.

Memberships are available online at [Compete Easy](#). The 2026 membership fee is \$40.00.

Class Information

- See class schedule listed on each individual show page for a list of classes offered.
- Para dressage classes will be offered with some show facility restrictions. Please contact the show organizer to discuss.
- All Adult Amateur (AA) and Open riders will compete together.
- All classes in all shows will be offered as a combined class of Adult (Open & AA) or Junior. Riders must designate on the entry form their status - AA (as declared on current EC Sport License), Open or Junior to ensure that QSLB submits the correct stats to EC and OE via [Compete Easy](#).
- Freestyles will be offered as a Test of Choice class. Please contact the show organizer to discuss.

Test of Choice Classes

- Test of Choice (TOC) is offered at each level. All tests at the same level are included in one class for the TOC. You select what level and test you want to ride when you make your online entry. You will need to indicate the test you want to ride once you select the appropriate TOC class. You may compete against another rider riding in the same level but using a different test. The exception to this is the FEI, Masters, Eventing and Western Style Dressage TOC. These classes span across all levels.
- Tests ridden in Test of Choice classes may be used as qualifiers for Gold Provincial/Regional championships as well as for Silver championships and team qualification, if permitted in the team qualification criteria. Organizing committees may offer Test of Choice classes in any division where it is beneficial for the competition and competitors i.e. where it is expected that there will be several one entry classes such as for FEI classes.
- TOC (even when the test is indicated in the results) are not used for national rankings. The score may be used as a qualifying score providing it meets the particular program's criteria.
- You may ride the same test twice at a show by selecting that particular test as a class and also entering the same test in the TOC class.
- Example 1: You are interested in showing Silver Level 1 and riding multiple tests in the same day. For the first show you can enter Silver Level 1, Test 1 as well as Silver Level 1 TOC class. Within the TOC class you select to ride Test 1 again or choose to ride test 2 or 3.
- Example 2: You are interested in riding the maximum number of classes in a day (3) at Level 2 and have a Silver Membership. You can opt to ride Silver Level 2, Test 1 as well as Silver Level 2 TOC class (opt for Test 1, 2, or 3). You may also ride Bronze Level 2, Test 1 or Bronze Level 2, TOC class (opt for Test 1, 2, or 3).

Equestrian Canada Dressage Masters Test of Choice

The Masters Test of Choice is an Equestrian Canada (EC) dressage class that provides senior riders, 60 years and older, the opportunity to participate in a dressage class that is exclusively their own in an environment that provides a fair playing field for senior riders wherein each will compete against their peers at all levels of skill, from beginners to advanced.

Details:

- Masters classes are open to riders 60 years of age and above.
- Any EC sanctioned dressage competition may offer the Masters Test of Choice.
- The class will be offered as a Miscellaneous Test of Choice class as per the EC Rules,

- Section A: General Regulations, A503 and will include all levels, national to FEI.
- In the event of a large number of entries, the class may be divided into two - lower and
 - Upper dressage levels - with separate sets of ribbons.
- The class will be included in the competition prize list with the appropriate entry fee.
- The class will feature one test per day and may have a class championship.
- Scores from Masters classes will not count towards EC championships or awards programs.
- Masters riders may also compete in non-Masters dressage classes.
- To facilitate ease of riding, the following accommodations are available in the Masters Test of Choice:
 - Rising trot is optional in all trot work.
 - Callers/riders may use headsets (someone, e.g., a steward, can stand beside the caller to ensure no coaching takes place).
 - Entry bell/whistle can have a secondary indicator (e.g., someone can raise an arm once the bell rings).
 - Use of voice
 - Equipment accommodations may include any or all of the following:
 - Looped reins;
 - Converters on double bridle to create single rein;
 - Gel or fluffy seat covers;
 - And/or, Two whips.
- Judges for the Masters Test of Choice must be EC certified Dressage Judges at the Basic, Medium or Senior level.

Freestyles Test of Choice Class

For freestyles, the rider must provide the show organizer with a functioning copy of their freestyle music. You must contact the show organizer prior to the date of the show with your music format to ensure proper equipment will be available.

Freestyle eligibility for riders in Gold and Silver competitions (all EC levels and FEI freestyle levels): A horse/rider combination must have obtained the following prior to competing in a freestyle: a minimum score of 60% in a dressage test at the same technical level or higher (E 10.2.1), as the freestyle they wish to enter (e.g. 60% in First or Second Level to compete in the First and/or Second Level Freestyle). The dressage score may have been obtained at an EC Gold/Silver dressage competition prior to the competition or may be obtained at the same competition in which they wish to enter the freestyle. Note: Bronze competitions require no minimum technical score.

When the rider selects Freestyle TOC class, they must input Bronze/Silver or Gold as well as the EC/FEI level.

Eventing Test of Choice Class

- Class is the Eventing Test of Choice.
- Riders must select any Bronze/Silver/Gold test to act as their Eventing Class.
- The result of the Eventing TOC class will span Bronze/Silver/Gold levels each day.
- Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place.
- Eventing TOC Class will count toward a horse's maximum tests per day (see Entry Submission section for details).
- Eventing TOC Class competitors must hold all qualifications required to compete at the chosen level (bronze/silver/gold).
- The Eventing dressage class is not eligible for EC awards.

Western Style Dressage Association of Canada Test of Choice Class

- This year, QSLB adds western style dressage to its shows. This equestrian discipline merges classical dressage principles with western riding techniques.
- The show is sanctioned by both Equestrian Canada (Bronze competition) and the Western Style Dressage Association of Canada (WSDAC). Rules of both organizations apply to riders and horses competing in these classes.
- Classes are Test of Choice: Riders may ride any test (Test 1, 2, 3, 4) for any of the following levels: Introductory, Basic, Levels 1 – 5.
- OE license and EC Bronze Licenses are required
- Western TOC Class will count toward a horse's maximum tests per day (see Entry Submission section for details).
- Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place.
- QSLB will send results to WSDAC
- The Western Style Dressage class is not eligible for EC awards.

Rising Star Youth Dressage Class

- A Dressage Equitation Judge will use the Rising Stars Youth Dressage Equitation Score Sheet* to evaluate the rider based solely on rider skills during a technical dressage test.
- The Rising Stars Equitation Program is for all Youth Dressage Riders, up to and including 18 years of age (QSLB Dressage does not have Rising Star classes for 19–25-year-old riders).
- Show organizers will determine which technical test will be used for the equitation evaluation at each level. For example: Test 2 of each level – i.e. First level Test 2.
- QSLB shows will be using the one (1) judge system for the equitation judging
- This class will be designated as the RS Equitation Evaluation class TOC. The rider will ride their technical test at their level but will only be judged on their equitation. The Equitation Judge in this case, would sit at C.
- QSLB is offering Foundation level which includes: EC Introductory, Training, First and Second levels
- This class will count toward a horse's maximum tests per day (see Entry Submission section for details)

National Dressage Pony Cup (NDPC) | Pony/Small Horse Class Test of Choice (TOC)

- The NDPC class includes ponies and small horses.
- Class is the NDPC (Pony/Small Horse) Test-of-choice.
- Riders must select any Bronze/Silver/Gold test to act as their NDPC class.
- Ponies who do not have a pony card **MUST** be measured by the steward at EACH SHOW.
- Small horses (16hh and under with shoes) must have a NDPC small horse measurement form completed and signed by a vet. Forms can be found at <https://dressageponycup.com/small-horse-measurement-form>
- The result of the NDPC TOC Class will span Bronze/Silver and Gold levels each show day.
- Ribbons will be awarded to 6th place. Highpoint Champion and Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded by QSLB at the year end awards.
- NDPC class will count toward a horse's maximum tests per day.
- NDPC competitors must hold all qualifications required to compete at chosen level (Bronze/Silver/Gold).
- Classes are part of the regular show and will count for QSLB year-end and be sent to EC/Cadora.
- NDPC class is not eligible for EC awards.

NDPC Year-End Awards

All tests ridden in Pony-Only classes may be entered in NDPC Canadian Year-End Awards. The rider must be a member of the NDPC. NDPC Canada Members can have scores from any Equestrian Canada Bronze, Silver, and Gold shows entered for Year-End Awards. Show scores must be submitted to the NDPC by competitors.

The National Dressage Pony Cup showcases the exceptional talent, training, and commitment of ponies, their owners, breeders, trainers, and riders in the art and sport of dressage. NDPC encourages competition at every level, for riders of any ability, of age, and ponies of any breed of mix of breeds to compete and enjoy their experience. The NDPC partners with Equestrian Canada Bronze, Silver, and Gold shows around Canada to offer our Partner Show Program. You do not need to be a member to compete in a Partner Show. All scores in 'pony only' classes will automatically be entered in our Year-End Awards Program, where you will be competing with ponies across the country. Learn more at www.DressagePonyCup.com



Fees & Awards

QSLB Annual Awards Program for 2026

- Riders must be QSLB members prior to the last show (September) to be eligible for year-end awards.
- Juniors will be awarded ribbons up to 6th place
- Adult Amateur and Open senior riders will be awarded together
- Only QSLB Bronze, Silver, or Gold show results may be used to tabulate the winners.
- Horse/rider combination must have entered, competed in, and have scores from two separate shows of the same category (Bronze/Silver/Gold) in the same division to be eligible for year- end awards.
- Year End calculation: $[(\text{Highest score Show A}) + (\text{Highest score show B})] / 2 = \text{Year End Score}$
- Highest Year End Score = Champion, Second Highest Year End Score = Reserve
- If you enter more than 2 shows, the two highest scores from two separate shows will be used.
- To qualify for Year End Championship Awards, the average score must be 60% or above.
- Rhonda Grant Junior High Point Award: an average of the top score from each show for B/S/G shows.
- Rhonda Grant Senior High Point Award: an average of the top score from each show for B/S/G shows.
- Show High Point Rider: Senior and Junior high point riders will be awarded for each show day at the AGM.
- Evergreen Farm Rising Star Youth Dressage Award: Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded based on the average of the highest scores achieved in the Rising Star TOC classes at each Bronze, Silver, and Gold show.
- Eventing TOC, Freestyle, Western Style Dressage and NDPC Pony/Small Horse will not qualify for year end awards.
- Masters TOC will qualify for year end awards.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2026

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REMINDER—2026 SEASON

- Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competition must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the My EC account.
- Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with Single Event Upgrade Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. Please complete your requirements in advance to avoid any fines and delays.

DECLARE YOURSELF A SELF-COACHED ATHLETE

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own **EC SPORT LICENSE NUMBER** or enter "self-coached" in the **COACH FIELD** on their registration/entry form.
- Please note: Coaches that **DO NOT ATTEND** the events **SHOULD NOT BE LISTED** on the entry form.

“ When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments. ”
