Introduction (bold, 11 pt)

Introduction should contain the statement of the topic, the practical/ academic importance, the summary of literature, the gaps/ controversies/ inconsistencies in existing studies, the research objective(s) and context. No spacing between paragraphs. For the next paragraph, its first line should be indented. Do not use numbers or alphabets in headings and sub-headings.

Literature Review (Optional) (bold, 11 pt)

The discussion in the literature review must continually link to the research questions. It should link studies to one another. More important studies should be written in more detail. Evaluate the gaps and identify areas to be filled."

Method

The method section structure should: describe the materials used in the study, explain how the materials were prepared for the study, describe the research protocol, explain how measurements were made and what calculations were performed, and state which statistical tests were done to analyze the data.

Equations, Tables, and Figures

Number equations consecutively. Equation numbers, within parentheses, are to position flush right, as in (1), using a right tab stop. To make your equations more compact, you may use the solidus (/), the exp function, or appropriate exponents. Use a long dash rather than a hyphen for a minus sign. Punctuate equations with commas or periods when they are part of a sentence, as in

$$H_j = \frac{h_{ij}}{x_j} \quad (1)$$

All illustrations including figures, charts and graphs, must be labelled and supplied in text. Positioning Figures and Tables: Place figures and tables at the top and bottom of columns. Avoid placing them in the middle of columns. Large figures and tables may span across both columns. Figure captions should be below the figures; table heads should appear above the tables. Insert figures and tables after they are cited in the text.

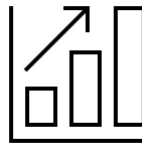


Figure 1. Example of a Figure Caption

Figure Labels: Use 10 point Times New Roman for Figure labels. Use words rather than symbols or abbreviations when writing Figure axis labels to avoid confusing the reader. As an example, write the quantity “Magnetization,” or “Magnetization, M,” not just “M.” If including units in the label, present them within parentheses. Do not label axes only with units. In the example, write “Magnetization (A/m)” or “Magnetization (A (m(1),” not just “A/m.” Do not label axes with a ratio of quantities and units. For example, write “Temperature (K),” not “Temperature/K.”
