My name is Dylan France, and I am interested in being reelected to the Student Association Whitman Assembly Representative. First, to provide some background, I am a Sophomore in the Whitman School of Management studying Finance with the intention to minor in Global Political Economy. Outside of the classroom, I am a part of Wellslink and the Black Honors Society, the Secretary to the Black Student Union, and participate in the Investment Club, the E-Sports club, and the Student Association Finance board. In Finance Board, I have seen Syracuse University's unique and robust programming. However, by continuing to be a member of Assembly, I know that I can further contribute to Student Association by representing both Whitman and Syracuse as a whole, bringing new ideas, and enacting proposals to create impactful legislation for the school.

Finance Board has given me a lens to see the desires of students through the club proposals. I hope that for the remainder of this semester and next year, I can support and enact many initiatives for the wellbeing and growth of Syracuse University.
