## 1. Competitions

<u>Sask Cup #3</u> on Saturday, **December 9th, 2017**, is a <u>classic technique distance race</u> with mass (wave) starts. Racers are to be at the race venue on Saturday by 12:00 noon for bib pick up and to be ready for the race start at 1:00 p.m. sharp! Race office opens 11:30 a.m. at the Don Allen Trails and will remain open until the day's official results are posted.

<u>Sask Cup #4</u> on Sunday, **December 10th, 2017,** is a <u>free technique distance race</u> with an interval start. Racers are to be at the race venue on Sunday by 10:00 a.m. for bib pickup and be ready for the race to start at 11:00 a.m. sharp! Race office opens at 9:30 a.m. at the Don Allen Trails and will remain open until the day's official results are posted.

Race venue is the Don Allen Ski Trail system, located 20 km north of La Ronge on Highway 102 at the junction of Highway 102 & the Nemeiben Lake Road.

Race maps will be posted at <a href="www.larongeskiclub.ca">www.larongeskiclub.ca</a> prior to the event.

Race course for the event will be groomed and marked no later than Friday, December 8<sup>th</sup>, at 4:00 p.m. The same trails will be used for both the Saturday and Sunday races.

Waxing facilities are not available at the Don Allen Trails. There will be limited access to power for outdoor waxing.

## 2. Hosting, Sanctioning & Rules

Competitions are hosted by the La Ronge Ski Club.

Competitions are sanctioned by Cross Country Canada (Tier 2). Racers holding a CCC licen in the Juvenile and older categories are eligible to earn CPL points.

Competitions will be governed by the current Cross Country Canada Rules and Precisions and by the current Sask Cup Series Rules. In the case of a rule conflict, the Cross Country Canada Rules and Precisions will take precedence over the Sask Cup Series Rules.

<u>Protests</u>: Any coach or athlete protesting a race result shall file a Protest Form with the Race Secretary at the Race Office within 15 minutes following the posting of the unofficial result being challenged.

No High Fluoro (HF) Waxes: A reminder to all coaches, parents and competitors that the CCS High Performance Committee has directed that no High Fluoro (HF) glide waxes are to be used in Midget and younger age categories in Sask Cup competitions. Low Fluoro (LF) waxes will be allowed.

## 3. Coaches' Meetings

A first coaches' meeting will be held the morning of **Saturday**, **December 9th**, **at 11:00 a.m. at the timing hut at the Don Allen Trails**. A second coaches' meeting will be held the afternoon of Saturday, December 9th, 2017 **at the timing hut** at a time to be announced.

Note 1 Start positions for each category (or combination of categories) will give preference to CCC-licensed racers. Seeding will be done based on CPL points for CCC licenced races. Start positions for other athletes will be determined by random draw. Late entries will be seeded last. The Event Organizing Committee reserves the right to combine categories when determining seeding within any particular mass start wave.

#### 4. License Requirements

All racers competing for Sask Cup points must have a current Cross Country Saskatchewan Competitor's License. "Citizen racers" (skiers without a Cross Country Saskatchewan Competitor's License) are welcome. They will compete in the same classes and ski the same distances as Sask Cup racers but will not earn Sask Cup Points.

Since the event competitions are sanctioned by Cross Country Canada, all racers in the Juvenile and older categories (including both Sask Cup and citizen racers) must hold a Cross Country Canada race license or a Cross Country Canada Supporting Member Day License ("CCC Day License").

Racers in the Atom, Peewee, Bantams and Midget categories **DO NOT** need a CCC <u>Day License</u>. However, these skiers must sign a waiver.

Those requiring a CCC Day License must purchase a separate license for each race. Day Licenses are to be purchased as part of the registration process. Cost for each

Day License is \$5 and is included in the registration fee. A separate Day License is required for each race. By purchasing a Day License, an athlete and/or a parent or guardian acting on behalf of an athlete under the age of majority expressly agrees to the terms of the CCC Supporting Member Day License.

## 5. Registration & Entry Fee

Registration Online: Racers wishing to register for the event competitions <u>must</u> do so online at <u>www.zone4.ca</u>. Registration opens on Friday November 17th. Once on the Zone4 website, search for "La Ronge Sask Cup #3 and #4 (2017-2018)" and then follow the online registration process. The **DEADLINE** for online registration is **Wednesday**, **December 6th, 2017, AT 5:00 P.M.** 

<u>Late Registrations</u>: Late registrations may be accepted at the discretion of the Race Organizing Committee up **until** 12:00 noon on Saturday December, 9th and 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, December 10th. Any late registrations after this time will not be accepted. Any late registrant will pay an additional late fee of \$10 per race.

<u>Waiver</u>: As part of the online registration process, racers (or their legal guardians on their behalf) will agree to the terms of Cross Country Canada's "Informed Consent and Assumption of Risk Agreement."

<u>Entry Fees</u>: The entry fee for Atoms, Peewees, Bantams and Midgets is \$5 for each race entered. The entry fee for Juveniles and older categories is \$15 for each race entered which includes the \$5 cost of a CCC Supporting Member Day License. Skiers holding a CCC race license will have their registration fee reduced by \$5 for each race entered—either at the time of registration on Zone4 or at bib pick-up. Racers will be responsible for a small processing fee charged by the Zone4 website during the registration process.

#### 6. Ribbons & Prizes

<u>Ribbons</u>: Ribbons for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> will be awarded to racers in all categories at the race stadium at the close of the races.

<u>Cash Prizes</u>: Racers in Juvenile Boys/Girls, Junior Boys/Girls and Junior Men/Women will receive cash prizes of \$60 for 1<sup>st</sup> place, \$40 for 2<sup>nd</sup> place and \$20 for 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the Saturday classic technique distance races.

<u>Fun Sprints</u>: Fun sprints for younger skiers (Midget & younger) using free technique or classic technique will be held in the stadium on Saturday, December 9th, 2017, after the Sask Cup distance races. Skiers will not earn Sask Cup points for the fun sprints, but the fastest skiers in each category will receive \$10 for 1<sup>st</sup> place and \$5 for 2<sup>nd</sup> place.

Racers <u>must be present at the awards ceremony</u> to receive a ribbon or cash prize. However, racers absent from the awards ceremony will maintain their standing in their races and will be awarded any applicable CCS and CPL points.

#### 7. Food

Hot dogs and drinks will be served to participants free of charge during the event.

## 8. Cancellation

If the event competition is to be postponed or cancelled due to cold weather or other cause, the Event Organizing Committee will inform CCS no later than Thursday, December 7th, 2017. The Event Organizing Committee will also endeavor to advise coaches and athletes as soon as possible. Primary notice of any postponement or cancellation will be made by posting a notice on the La Ronge Ski Club website at <a href="https://www.larongeskiclub.ca">www.larongeskiclub.ca</a> and on the Club's Facebook page at "The La Ronge Nordic Ski Club."

In the event of a postponement or cancellation, the Organizing Committee reserves the right to retain any registration fees collected. It may, in its sole discretion, decide to return all or part of registration fees paid.
