Training – Sean Kent

- A review of the FIFA LOTG changes for 2024-2025. There are not a lot of changes that will affect most of the matches we referee, but there are a few. That includes non-deliberate hand balls that deny a goal or an obvious goal scoring opportunity and for which the referee awards a PK, which is now downgraded to a yellow card, and that a ball placed for a kick from the mark must touch or overhang the center of the mark. Of more interest are several trials that leagues can choose to adopt. These include:
 - Cooling-off periods The referee can choose to send each team to their own penalty areas, then
 call out the captains and talk through what is needed to resume the match.
 - O Goalkeeper holding the ball for too long This is rarely called because it results in an IDFK inside the goal area. The new trial changes the time from six seconds to eight seconds (with the ref showing the countdown from five seconds with his fingers) and allows the member organization to dictate that the restart is either a Corner Kick, or a Throw-in to be taken in line with the penalty mark.
 - o Ban on deliberate heading The current guidance says that the restart is an IDFK from the spot where the infringement occurred unless it is within the penalty area and then the restart is either the spot of the infringement or on the top of the goal area nearest to the infringement. The latter restart leaves U12 and under defenders standing on the goal line with an opponent who may choose to drive the ball into the wall. The new trial moves the restart to the side of the penalty area closest to where the offense occurred. This seems like a very smart call!
