TENSES

| ACTIVE | PASSIVE |
|-------------------------------|------------------------------------|
| Present simple | Is/are + past participle |
| Present continuous | Is/are being + pp |
| Past simple | Was/were + pp |
| Past continuous | Was/were being + pp |
| Present perfect | Have/has been + pp |
| Past perfect | Had been + pp |
| will | Will be + pp |
| Is/are going to | Is/are going to be |
| Can/must/may/should | Can/must/may/should be + pp |
| Can/must/may/should have + pp | Can/must/may/should have been + pp |

CHANGES

ACTIVE: Someone stole my bicycle yesterday

PASSIVE: My bicycle was stolen yesterday

- The direct object (or the indirect object) becomes the subject.
- The verb tense is written in the passive (be+past participle)
- Sometimes, if necessary, the subject becomes the by-object

Example:

The police arrested the terrorist early this morning

The terrorist was arrested by the police early this morning
