 - Students who want to improve a diploma course mark have three options:
 - Retake course to raise school-based mark worth 70% of final mark
 - Rewrite diploma to raise diploma mark worth 30% of the mark
 - Do both
 - Note:
 - Diploma rewrite fee \$26
 - Student has to initiate application for rewrite on their MY PASS account
 - Diploma rewrites are in April, June, August, November and January
 - Students who want to rewrite and English or Social Studies diploma must rewrite both part A (written) and B (multiple choice)
 - Deadline to apply to rewrite a diploma was today but students should still send in an application even if it is after the deadline--let us know in the office if applying after the deadline, especially if there are accommodations we need to put into place

Structures and Practices to Support 'One Goal': Learning

Advisory

The goal of **Advisory** is for students to have a "home-base" where they get one-on-one regular contact to ensure they are informed, known, supported as they work towards their academic, high school and future goals. Advisory gives teachers and students the flexibility to deal with the complexities of adolescence, high school, achieving goals and making decisions in order for them to become their best selves; in essence, to know and be known.

Tutorial

Not everyone learns at the same rate and in the same way. The goal of **Tutorial block** is for students to have a daily opportunity to prepare for, practice and perfect their learning. Tutorial allows students along with their teachers to identify what area of learning they need more time for; in essence, to personalize their learning.

Collaboration

During Tutorial block, teachers in one subject area will meet to collaborate on how to support students to use Tutorial effectively and address areas where students struggle with learning.
