WHY YOU SHOULDN'T FEED YOUR CAT COW'S MILK.

Cow's milk contains lactose and a lot of cats are lactose intolerant. After four weeks of birth, kittens begin the weaning process after which other foods such as can foods and mice are the new center of attraction to them. When your kitty stops drinking milk, its system stops producing enzymes necessary to break down and digest milk; cow's milk. Because the cat cannot produce this, it causes diarrhea to your cat.

WAYS TO ENSURE YOUR CAT STAYS HYDRATED.

The best way to keep your cat is to give it water; enough water. Also, try to test the quality of the water fed to the cat; place water at every corner of your house. Always make sure to wash its bowl with hot water and soap and place it in the sun to dry. Study your cat to know if it likes warm water too. Above all, fresh water is the best.

BEST DRINKS FOR YOUR FELINE FRIEND.

Water in plain terms. Water is the best drink for your little kitty friend. Other drinks you can give your feline friend include; Tuna juice and Bone broth can act as a variety and nice beginning to a healthy diet. Oh, she would love you so much. You can also give your cat almond milk, goat milk, or special cat milk because of their lower lactose levels, but should be given in small quantities.

OTHER TREATS TO FEED YOUR BUNDLE OF FUR.

Some of those cats' treats include; Apples, Strawberries, Bananas, Cooked eggs, Baked Bread, and Peanut Butter. WHY CATS LIKE CREAM SO MUCH.

THINGS TO KNOW BEFORE GOING:

Woodland Park is a very fun place to relax and sometimes unwind, hence the name. The Park serves as a home for the wildlife and natural habitat, which reasons why guests are welcomed in the Park. Here are a few things to know before visiting the park.

- You can download the Woodland Park Zoo map to skip the paper map.
- Buy your tickets online; Tickets are now available on the Woodland Park Zoo site. There is a discount going on and it is available for 48 hours!
- Make sure to plan your day very well. Have a second plan, the last resort. Think of things you can do at the venue besides from seeing the wildlife.
- Do not pay for parking; The park has two entrances; The south entrance is close to the Family farm, Africa Savannah Area, and contains the likes of the Gazelles, Zebras, and Hippos. The west entrance is on Phinney Avenue and is near the Penguins, and the Northern Trail.
- Feed the animals; Always come with food to feed the animals, we think it is a good bonding process!

- Have a picnic and see what's new at the Park. Loosen up and be bright, the park is a place to meet new people and create new opportunities for yourself.
- The Park has an app that keeps track of you within and helps you locate the animal you can't find.
- There are food outlets outside and within the park at affordable prices.

GETTING THERE:

Due to the bioclimatic areas in the park, there are some endangered species at the park and they are close to the entrance. Always, keep your family close and avoid crowded spaces.

- When coming in from the west entrance, take the north or south-bound Metro 5 to Phinney Avenue and N. 55th street to arrive at the west entrance and access to the park is through the Otter and Penguin parking lot.
- South entrance is located on N. 50th street and is accessed by the Hippo parking lot.
- Use Pay at the gate at the cost of \$2.
