

# Packing List, September 17-19, 2021

Label everything when possible

## Clothing

- ☐ BSA Field Uniform (wear on arrival)
- ☐ 2 pairs pants
- ☐ 2 pairs of shorts
- ☐ Troop t-shirt+ 1 short sleeved shirt
- ☐ 2 long sleeved shirts
- ☐ sweater/hoodie
- ☐ Rain jacket/poncho
- ☐ Sleepwear
- ☐ 3 pairs socks (wool or artificial fibers)
- ☐ Underwear
- ☐ Athletic shoes
- ☐ Water shoes or sandals
- ☐ Sun hat
- ☐ Masks, ideally 5, with separate ziplock bag for dirty masks
- ☐ Swimsuit(s)

## Bedding

- ☐ Sleeping bag
- ☐ Sleeping pad
- ☐ Inflatable pillow (optional)

## Personal Gear

- ☐ Backpack or duffle bag, containing all gear
- ☐ Daypack

☐ Personal water bottles w/ 3 liters of water

- ☐ Headlamp or flashlight, extra batteries
- ☐ Camp chair
- ☐ Extra stuff sacks or ziplock bags
- ☐ Mess kit
  - ☐ Cup, plate, bowl, utensils, in a mesh bag
- ☐ Personal First Aid Kit

## Toiletries

- ☐ Toothbrush & Toothpaste
- ☐ Deodorant
- ☐ Biodegradable soap
- ☐ Hand Towel
- ☐ Beach Towel
- ☐ Comb or brush
- ☐ Lip balm, with sun protection
- ☐ Hand sanitizer
- ☐ Menstrual products, as needed
- ☐ Sunscreen
- ☐ Bugspray
- ☐ Hand lotion (optional, but might want after lots of sanitizing and handwashing)

## Other Items

- ☐ Medications - labeled with Scout's name, medication name, dosage
- ☐ Shovels, buckets, ect for building sand stuff
- ☐ Scouts BSA Handbook
- ☐ Wristwatch (optional)
- ☐ Small notebook and pencils

- ☐ Compass (if you have one)
- ☐ Pocketknife (only one)
- ☐ Sunglasses
- ☐ Matches in waterproof case or other fire starting method, only if you have firem'n chit
- ☐ Frisbees, kites, etc.
- ☐ stick/roasting fork for roasting marshmallows
- ☐ Personal tent, if you have one- if you need a troop tent, please inform Scoutmaster/SPL

- ☐ Sand stakes for tent, if you have them

#### Food

- ☐ Packed dinner for Friday - all other meals will be provided
- ☐ Personal snacks - will be stored in a car
- ☐ \$10 Cash - To buy lunch on the way home Sunday

Note on electronic devices: During Scouting activities, we keep our focus on Scouting. Scouts may bring cell phones, but they are only to be used for approved Scouting purposes such as navigation and photography. Scouts may not bring other electronics such as tablets and game systems, and may not use cell phones for entertainment purposes such as watching videos, playing games, etc. Scouts will be expected to turn their cell phone in to an adult leader if it is a distraction. Loss of or damage to cell phones is not the responsibility of the troop. If in doubt, leave it at home!
