

Welcome Back to In-Person Worship!

Chinese and English services have returned to in-person worship. The following 2-step health and safety protocols are in effect:

Step 1

- maintain physical distancing and mask wearing indoors at all time
- attendance limited to 35 individual/family bubbles
- enter church from parking lot entrance only
- pre-registration for worship required
- sanitizing (fogging) between worship services required
- vaccine passport and temperature screening not required
- still no food or drinks

- lifting of numbers restrictions
- allowing food and drinks

Qualifications to be Session member or Board of Manager

- A committed Christian
- A regular attendee of public worship
- A person of sound judgment and upright character
- A person knowledgeable or prepared to learn about the government of the Presbyterian Church in Canada
- An "example to the believers in speech, conduct, love, faith and purity (1 Timothy 4:12, see also 1 Timothy 3:1-13, Titus 1:5-9, 1 Peter 5:1-4)
- Must be a professing member to become a Session member; must at minimum be an adherent (minimum 6 months attendance at CPC) to become a Board of Manager
- Nominees will require a simple majority vote from the members and adherents participating in the congregational meeting to be elected.
- Elected nominees will be ordained (as Session members) or installed (as Board of Managers) two weeks after the vote provided Session has not received any valid objections.

Matthew 27:45-54 New International Version

The Death of Jesus

From noon until three in the afternoon darkness came over all the land. About three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" (which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?").

When some of those standing there heard this, they said, "He's calling Elijah."

Immediately one of them ran and got a sponge. He filled it with wine vinegar, put it on a staff, and offered it to Jesus to drink. The rest said, "Now leave him alone. Let's see if Elijah comes to save him."

And when Jesus had cried out again in a loud voice, he gave up his spirit.

At that moment the curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. The earth shook, the rocks split and the tombs broke open. The bodies of many holy people who had died were raised to life. They came out of the tombs after Jesus' resurrection and went into the holy city and appeared to many people.

When the centurion and those with him who were guarding Jesus saw the earthquake and all that had happened, they were terrified, and exclaimed, "Surely he was the Son of God!"

The Death of Jesus

It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." When he had said this, he breathed his last.


