Review a past lesson or experience to create connections to new information

New skill (technology, life-skill, academic content, etc.)

New idea (consider viewpoints and opinions different from their own)

Check-In

Getting to Know You Prompt - Student and teacher draw and responds to a random prompt Challenges and Achievements - Describe both a recent challenge and success Review grades - Pull up the Portal matrix and review grades, missing assignments, etc. Goals and Accountability - Agree on at least one short-term goal with rewards and consequence

Circle Back Around
