- Nicole: QUESTION: How insulated is WA state from the descent into authoritarianism that the Trump administration is driving? QUESTION: regarding the third point (needing an alternative viable message), who is going to lead us? Biden and Harris failed us. Who is emerging as the viable leader of this message and movement on the national scale?
- Kathleen: QUESTION: If Trump's approval rating enters the low 30s, is it likely that Congressional republicans will start to break with him on some issues?
- Ginger: QUESTION: In the event of a successful impeachment and removal of Trump, how concerned should we be about those that will automatically replace him? QUESTION: What is being done to protect the LGBTQ+ community, especially Trans people, from the flood of over 850 bills that have been written against us in just this year?
- Kate: QUESTION: What financial impacts is Washington State experiencing NOW due to 47s Presidency? QUESTION: What National Security vulnerabilities do you see?
- Mark: QUESTION: What is congress doing to make sure the military is not following crazy orders from the President. Such as using the military against protestors. QUESTION: a lot of us are afraid that we can't wait until 2026.
 Trump is moving to fast. In order for us to support you is to understanding that you and the Democrats have a plan. Short term and long term. We are still waiting for a plan.
- Rebecca: QUESTION: What is your personal opinion of Bernie Sanders &
 AOC "Fighting Oligarchy" tour? Are there discussions within the
 Democratic Party to amplify this message? There is a perception among
 younger voters that Democrats & Republicans take money from billionaires,

- and it leaves them feeling like neither party represents them and a result they don't vote or don't engage in the political process. Thank you for your time.
- Susan: QUESTION: What do you feel are the 3 most pressing issues facing
 the country at this critical moment in time and how will those translate into
 the top action-oriented priorities for the Congress as Members return to
 the Hill? Thank you!
- Kathleen: QUESTION: What is the plan to introduce and pass bills once Dems retake control to clean up these loopholes that the regime is capitalizing on i.e. rolling back the Alien & Sedition Act, that was used to inter Japanese Americans and is now being used to illegally deport immigrants, overturning the Comstock Act, etc. as well as giving other laws actual teeth/mechanism for enforcement such as the Logan Act?
- Liz: QUESTION: How are we planning serious civil disobedience to flood the zone?
- Sally: Are democrats supporting David Hogg's ideas of supporting effective candidates?
- Karen: Question: What can Congress do to address Trump using his position to raise personal funds through meme coin, etc? Emoilients are still illegal for presidents, right?
- Michaela: QUESTION: Is the Peace Corp at risk from the current administration?
- Kathy: What do you think the chances are Trump will declare martial law...... and what can Congress or the courts do if he does?
- Kelli: Question: How does that (holding members of the Trump admin in contempt for defying court orders) work if Trump himself is the perpetrator?
- Valerie: Question: Is Ukraine finished?
- Karen: People-- kids--are dying of measles and more. How can we push GOP/red state reps to get spines??
- Donald: QUESTION: Given how horrible Trump and his policies are, isn't the MAIN problem GOP messaging and the cult-like support of him? Why does the U.S. have troops in all these places?! We can't afford it, they cause wars,

- and they invite retaliation.
- Stacey: I agree with your parts 1 & 2, not sure I agree about 3. I mean yes, we need to rehabilitate the Dem brand, but it's not just about policy. In the last 4 years, Dems did a lot of good things bringing down drug prices for one. And they tried to talk about them. But a big chunk of the population isn't listening at all, so it doesn't pop. Nobody watches the news or political shows or read political news. And yet "we saved you money from the price gouging drug companies" is a good message. If you have a good message and you are saying it over and over, then the problem isn't the message.
 - Wendy: Agree 100 the entire media ecosystem is suppressing democratic message
 - Kristen: The political scientist Rachel Bitecofer has done a lot of deep diving on messaging and how Dems can improve their effectiveness.
 She makes some compelling suggestions and I recommend looking her up on Substack and her recent book, Hit Em Where It Hurts
 - Karen: I listened to an interview with Harry Sisson today and he had a
 lot to say about how the Dems have missed messaging opportunities
 by sticking only with legacy media and he feels a lot of his generation
 (Gen Z) did not get the message from the Dems. Dems also need to
 NOT be afraid to be louder and ruder if need be
- Marilyn: First wife Ivana was the daughter of a KGB agent. He took donald to Moscow in 1987. Both sons have declared (first campaign against Hillary) proudly that "we don't need American banks. We get our money from Russia" OF COURSE HE is a Russian Agent
- Kathy: The chances of martial law?? And then what??
- Wendy: How is messaging for Dems always criticized but GOP talking points are ppl can be kidnapped at any point and vaccines are evil? Oh and we will register people with autism? How is it that it's Dems problem??
 - Karen: The right wing media spins these messages so they sound like all of these things are the fault of the Dems so it is our problem because they are overtly lying about us and the Dems have historically just ignored this or been too polite instead of loudly and rudely shutting it down.

- Lynne: QUESTION: To reiterate and combine 2 questions above, 2026 is pretty far away with how fast things are moving. What is the plan from Dems to get us past and through, and who do you see being the candidate to lead us?
- Kelli: Question: It sounds like you're advocating a very pragmatic approach
 going forward, which makes sense. But pragmatism often leads to accepted
 negative outcomes for smaller demographics. How are you going to balance
 necessary pragmatism with the likelihood of losing those smaller
 demographics because of the impact of that pragmatism?

LGBTQ Rights

We've seen successful pro LGBTQIA+ state legislation move through the House and Senate and are awaiting Governor's signature. Thanks to those who've written or called our state legislators. It takes perseverance but it's important to write or call in at every stage that a bill gets reviewed through the process.

Bill 1971 - Increasing hormone therapy access, allowing 12 month prescriptions signed into law 4/25

Bill 5632 - Protecting the confidentiality of records and information that may be relevant to another state's enforcement of its laws - on Governor's desk for signature on 4/22

Bill 5101 - Expanding access to leave and safety accommodations to include workers who are victims of hate crimes or bias incidents - on Governor's desk for signature on 4/22

Bills SB 5181 - Parents Rights Bill **and HB 1296** - Promoting a safe and supportive public education system- these controversial bills were long debated but SB 5181 passed House and Senate and HB 1296 is on the Governor's desk for signature on 4/26 (Conservative multi-millionaire Brian Heywood is expected to launch a campaign to repeal LGBTQ protections and progressive taxes by collecting 400k+ signatures to repeal these bills by election).

Locally, will continue to monitor school boards decisions on whether to follow State laws on maintaining

DEI policies and allowing trans athletes to participate in school sports or follow Federal executive orders.

Monitor and fight city level activity, like Newcastle City Council whose Mayor and conservative members were against flying the Pride flag in June of last year and Woodinville City Council, which has 4 upcoming open seats which may flip the make-up of the council to be more conservative.

After answering some brief questions on how they'd like to help, I send a TAG (Take Action Group) email out once a week.

Asylum Clinics:

There's a once-a-month volunteer opportunity that's open to lawyers, law students and some paralegals. There is a free asylum clinic one Saturday a month in downtown Seattle. You don't have to go every month, just when you choose. These days, filing for asylum is one of the only protections against deportation. So the work is more important than ever.

The clinic is sponsored by the <u>Riverton Park United Methodist Church</u>, and largely run by volunteers from the <u>Jewish Coalition for Immigrant Justice</u>.

Immigrant Detention Data

If you want to get into the weeds, a great source of info on immigrant detentions is <u>TRAC at Syracuse University</u>. It is nationwide data, and you can zero in on the NW Detention Center (aka NW ICE Processing Center) in Tacoma if you want. There are many tabs & reports to explore.

Immigrant Housing

When immigrants are released from the NW Detention Center in Tacoma, they sometimes need short-term housing. There is a whole system in place, where volunteers are vetted and specify dates when they are available, and when they are not.

To find out more, you can contact **Aidan Perkins, Operations Manager** at <u>AIDNW</u> (Advocates for Immigrants in Detention) at operationsmgr@aidnw.org. The short-term housing program is run jointly by AIDNW and <u>World Relief</u>.

Indivisible Meetings with DelBene Staff

Constituents in CD1 meet every other month with Rep. Suzan DelBene's staff.

When: generally the third Wednesday every other month at 3 pm for 1 hour The next meeting will be on May 14th (a departure from the usual schedule).

Who: we meet with Kelly who is the lead staff person for her District offices.

What: we circulate an agenda 2 weeks before the meeting in which people can put in their questions/comments by subject.

This is then forwarded to Kelly 1 week before the meeting.

Protests and Rallies:

The Indivisible Eastside Rally Planning Team is organizing events in the Eastside in support of national events including April 5 Hands Off, April 24 Hands Off Social Security, and May 1 May Day Strong events. 
