Report of the President

- We do not have the grant provided by the province
 - Usually obtained in February
- International Students Cap
 - 364,000 -64% less than usual
 - Allocated based on the population of the province. Wrote a letter to the minister. Rejection rate will depend on the country they are applying for.
 - Example: Nigeria has an 80% rejection rate on student visas.
 Province has released a small number of 600 visas. We usually admit 10,000.
 - Going to expect to have much less International Students coming next year
 - Each loss of international students takes about 1 million out of our budget

- Developing holistic approach to streamline process to focus on risk management - increase management and decrease controls
 - Ensure risk are properly controlled
 - Taking a step back to prevent financial setbacks
