Text Accessibility

Overview

“Text content is available in an easily accessed format, preferably HTML. All text content is readable by assistive technology, including a PDF or any text contained in an image.”

Practices

1. Use accessible fonts such as Arial and Calibri.
2. Avoid using graphic images that include text. Alternatively, include a paragraph of text to describe the image and text on it.
3. Stick to sans-serif fonts.
4. Avoid *italics*
