1. Background and Context

People in Need (PIN) Moldova and SOS Autism are jointly implementing the multi-year project **INCLUDE**, funded by the Czech Development Agency (CzDA) until December 2027. The action is carried out in close partnership with the Ministry of Labour and Social Protection, the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Education and Research, and local civil society actors, particularly the Federation for Rights and Resources of People with Autism Spectrum Disorders in the Republic of Moldova (FEDRA).

The general objective of the INCLUDE project is to strengthen the inclusion and empowerment of people with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) to fully exercise their rights in Moldova. Within this framework, Specific Objective 3 focuses on enhancing the role of civil society in policy advocacy and monitoring of national public policies relevant to ASD.

Under Output 3.1, the project aims to strengthen the technical capacity of 15 NGOs, members of the FEDRA umbrella network, in advocacy, monitoring, and evaluation of public policy documents.

To contribute to this output, **Activity 3.1.1** foresees the delivery of a **two-day interactive training** (learning-by-doing) for 15 member NGOs of FEDRA, focused on the theory of change in public policies, monitoring and evaluation methodologies, and practical advocacy tools. This will be followed by targeted mentorship for 3 sub-granted NGOs out of 15 trained (**Activity 3.1.2**), who will apply the knowledge in practice, including development of monitoring and evaluation tools, identification of information sources, and planning of advocacy actions.

In this regard, a national expert with proven experience in public policy advocacy, monitoring, and evaluation will be contracted through an open competitive process.

2. Scope of Work

The purpose of this consultancy is to build the advocacy and policy monitoring capacity of 15 member NGOs of FEDRA, enabling them to effectively engage in the evaluation and improvement of public policies relevant to inclusion and empowerment of people with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) to fully exercise their rights in Moldova.

The consultancy will employ a **learning-by-doing** methodology, combining an initial **2-day interactive training** with practical mentoring support to selected NGOs.

Training content will include:

- Understanding the Theory of Change in public policy processes;
- Introduction to monitoring frameworks: what is to be monitored, who is monitoring, how and why it is important to monitor, intended outcomes, target audiences and frameworks for planning monitoring;
- Principles and methods for analysis of the information which has been collected during monitoring, including <u>results analysis frameworks</u>;
- Reliable sources of data and methods to analyze them.
- Practical tools and strategies for advocacy and influencing decision-making.
- Practical exercises analyzing relevant existent public policies.

The training agenda and materials will be developed by the expert and submitted to PIN for review and approval. The expert will also design a pre- and post-training knowledge assessment to measure the immediate impact.

Following the training, **3 NGOs** will be selected by PIN based on predefined criteria and will receive targeted **mentorship** over **40 working days (320 hours)** until **15 December 2025**.

The three monitored policy documents will be:

- 1. National Mental Health Program 2023–2027
- 2. National Program on Rare Diseases 2024–2028
- 3. National Program for Inclusive Education 2024–2027

Mentorship will include but is not limited to:

- Developing the methodology, including monitoring and assessment tools;
- Identifying relevant data sources and stakeholders to collect and analyze data;
- Contribution to the evidence-based monitoring and evaluation reports produced by 3 grantees, which will be finalized in 2026.

4. Selection Process

To accept or reject the bid is the responsibility of the **evaluation team**, the decision of which shall be final.

A. Qualification Criteria

Mandatory qualification criteria - candidates must possess the following mandatory minimum qualifications, which will be evaluated based on the **Pass/Fail** criteria. Failure to meet any qualification criterion will result in immediate disqualification from the bidding process:

- Bachelor's degree in the relevant field (Law, Political Science, Social Sciences, Public Admin, or related) or higher;
- At least 2 years of experience in monitoring and evaluation of public policies, including development of reports;
- At least 2 years of experience as a trainer or consultant to deliver trainings and provide mentorship in advocacy and monitoring/evaluation of public policies;
- Fluent knowledge of Romanian and Russian.

B. Evaluation criteria

The evaluation committee will evaluate and award the contract on the basis of the following evaluation criteria:

- 70% Weightage for Technical Proposal
- 30% Weightage for Financial Proposal

Evaluation of Financial Proposal

The financial offer should be submitted in MDL and must include all applicable taxes. The financial score is calculated as:

1. Contract Award

The contract will be awarded to the bid that receives the Highest Combined Score. In the event of an equal number of points, the contract will be awarded to the bid with the lowest price.
