GitHub Flavored Markdown (GFM)	<p><i>Markdown</i> is a style of writing documents that makes it easy to define what the content should look like. It describes headers, text styles, links, lists and so much more.</p> <p>GitHub Flavored Markdown is very similar but has its own quirks. You can read up on the syntax here.</p>
syntax	The rules that govern the structure of the symbols, words, and punctuation found in programming languages.
repository (repo)	Computer storage for maintaining data or software packages. This location contains files, databases, or information organized for quick access over a network or directly.
GitHub	Internet hosting service for software development and version control using Git. It provides the distributed version control of Git plus access control, bug tracking, software feature requests, task management, continuous integration, and wikis for every project.
issues	Term used on GitHub to describe what is otherwise known as a 'ticket' or 'user story'. Issues allow users to track work being done.
kanban	A visual system used to manage and keep track of work as it moves through a process. Also called a 'project board'.
