1. Approval of Minutes from 10/15/2024 Meeting

- •Nicci moved to approve.
- •Brent seconded.
- •Minutes approved unanimously.

2. Basketball Update

- •Rachael said it was challenging at the beginning; things are fine now.
- •Balancing things with TASP (Thetford After School Program).
- •Rachael asked thoughts about capping numbers so there isn't the need to have two slots for the 5 and 6 boys.
- •Joe was not in favor of capping; MaryDan asked about possible slots earlier in the day during game days for the other group. Megan also not in favor; same with MaryDan.
- •MaryDan will look at the schedule with Rachael next year to try and accommodate TASP and the larger groups of basketball players.

3. Ski Program Update

- •Brent has been working with the ski program on the volunteer side.
- •170 participants; 115 kids and the rest are adults working with the program as volunteers.
- •Not as much snow, but first day was this past Friday and everything went fine.
- •SkiWay folks (including MaryDan) were very helpful Brent reported.
- •Rachael handles the logistics around the buses, and logistics with the SkiWay folks.
- •Charlotte asked about succession planning. Brent said that there is a document, but it's not necessarily a step-by-step, how to.
- •With parent volunteer leadership aging out of the program, Rachael will keep her eyes out for some folks who might be good at taking over the reins.

4. Upcoming Seasons

A. Baseball (Cal Ripken league) & Softball (Babe Ruth league)

- •Rookies and T-ball will not be in a league this year; Rachael will set up games with nearby Teams.
- •Nic Cook excited to coach Rookies again.

- •Michele Stanley runs Babe Ruth for the area and has reached out to Rachael already.
- •Sign-ups should go up in February.
- •Rachael said she's learning that sign-ups need to go out sooner than she would have anticipated.
- •She also said it would probably also be good to start working on coaches.
- •Rachael will also work on reserving the gym for April (for baseball and softball) in coordination with TASP.

B. Circus Camp

- •Circus camp will happen over February break.
- •Rachael will look to get the link up on the website so that folks can sign-up.

C. Art Camp

- •Will also happen in the spring.
- •It happened in the fall and was very popular. It filled up very quickly.

D. Pickle Ball

- •MaryDan asked about pickle ball and whether that was something Rachael was still interested in doing.
- •Rachael said that she is interested in doing it, and since her hours were just bumped up, she should have more time to do it.
- •Nicci said you could just do it by drop-in session; MaryDan said it could also be done through paying by month.

E. Summer ball (Four Corners league which happens in June)

- •Rachael will explore coaches.
- •Conflict last year between home games and Fun Runs at TA.
- •Basically, we just need to avoid Tuesday night games at TA.

F. Treasure Island hiring

•Rachael and Megan will work together to coordinate hiring, etc.

5. MyRec Website Concerns

- •A very dinosaur like website.
- •Rachael is regularly in touch with the help desk, and they are very helpful.
- •It might be time to find a different platform.
- •Rachael is going to look into it.
- •Nicci suggested looking into other rec departments and find out what they're doing.
- •Megan said that a lot of towns around us use MyRec, too.
- •Rachael is going to chat with Megan about what she might know.

6. Role of the Recreation Advisory Committee

•Charlotte pointed out that our charge on the town website:

"The charge for the Recreation Advisory Council (shall be) "to inventory, research, and promote recreation opportunities for residents and visitors of all ages."

- •MaryDan wondered if the question is what does Brian Story (Town Manager) feel that our role is. And also, what does Rachael feel that the role of the RAC should be.
- •Rachael appreciates having input from different people so that there isn't one person making all of the decisions since it's only one person's thinking.
- •Brent appreciates having different perspectives from people involved in different sports.
- •Charlotte asked if we are meeting frequently enough. Right now, she feels that we are.
- •Joe wondered about he and Charlotte meeting with Brian and seeing what he feels RAC's role is versus what we think RAC's role is—just to make sure that we are on the same page.

7. Other Business

- •Rachael's hours have gone up. She now can do a minimum of 24, but should not go over 30.
- •Charlotte also made a suggestion that Rachael anticipate the equipment needs of the coming Season.
- •Megan suggested that the soccer balls be stored indoors.
- •One of Rachael's goals is to clean out the rec's storage space in the basement of town hall.
- •We'll look at some Saturday to get together and help clear out that space.

- 3. Budget (Rachael)
 - •Much of the budget is the same.

•The biggest difference in the budget are proposed additional hours for the Rec. Director.

- •MaryDan offered to meet with Rachael and answer any questions she has about Treasure Island and provide advice as needed.
- •Joe offered to draft a letter of support from the Rec. Advisory in terms of what might be a better use of Rachael's time.

5. Rec task delegation

- •Little pieces of each season where volunteers might be helpful.
- •In an earlier conversation, Stacy suggested that parents might be able to help.
- •Joe suggested that if there are things that Rachael needs help with, to please reach out to us.

6. Ski program and Basketball

- •There has been a pre-season ski meeting.
- •Dave Lloyd had been helping, but his child moved up to TA, so he laid out what tasks needed to be done.
- •Basketball meeting coming up with other towns.
- •Before that meeting, Rachael hopes to touch base with those who want to be coaches.
- •MaryDan offered to set up the medical kits for the basketball teams.
- •Nicci asked about a master list for seasonal tasks. That way, parents and volunteers can sign up for tasks as they are signing up their kids.
- •Rachael asked about helping her come up with a master schedule. Megan Lavik said that she could help.

7. Overview of new programs

- c. Indoor Pickleball can be played at TES, but we need to find a good place to store the equipment.
- d. Playgroup with programing.

- •Then people would take their raffle tickets and place them in different baskets for different prizes.
- •Then names for winners would be drawn.
- •Joe and Charlotte wondered if this really fits as a Rec. event.
- •Rachael thought it might initially have been an event, and therefore more Rec. related, but then it morphed.

 - •Nate asked if there would be alternative programing on ski days (for kids who didn't want to ski).
 - •Rachael thought that was a good idea and will think about it and talk about it with people.

Meeting called to order at 7:07.

- 1. Approval of Minutes from May 1, 2024 Meeting (Charlotte)
 - •Charlotte moved to approve.
 - Nicci seconded.
 - •Minutes approved.
- 2. Follow up to Parent/Athlete/Rec. Director Meeting and Expectations going forward. (Rachael)
 - •Rachael reviewed the disciplinary situation.
 - •Student has not written the letter (the outcome of the meeting).
 - •Consensus is that if he doesn't write the letter, he doesn't play in the fall.
 - •The letter should include an apology to teammates, and the importance of Respect. The important thing here is that regardless of what he intended, people were hurt. Because he hurt his teammates, he needs to apologize.

•Going forward, we want to include an addition to the parent/athlete agreement that denotes a 5-game suspension for this type of offense. If there is a second offense, their participation in Thetford Rec. is terminated.

3. Summer leagues (Rachael)

- •Softball summer team is being raised by the individual coach, and she is doing the organizing by herself.
- •Stacy provided some context—you used to be able to use the TA fields for free. But then TA started charging.
- •But if an activity is done through Rec, you can use the fields for free.
- •Rachael asked if it isn't open to everyone, and if it's not organized by Rec., then is it really a Rec program?
- •Consensus is that going forward, this will not be a Rec. Program.

4. Defining Town Recreation Activities (Rachael)

- Thetford based
- •Open to everyone
- •Thetford residents given priority for sign-ups.
- •No Tryouts

5. Revisiting Baseball (Cal Ripken)

- •Stacy agreed that unless it's required, it's not worth the effort to have Rookies and T-Ball in Cal Ripken.
- •Stacy will follow up and make sure that it's not an all or nothing scenario—in other words, she will make sure that you don't have to have your Rookies and T-Ball in Cal Ripken as a requirement of having your older kids in the league.
- •Nate added that if you can get T-Ball and Rookies out of Cal Ripken, then more people can help (without all the detailed coaching requirements).
- •Nicci pointed out that that's actually the age when you need more helpers.

6. Town Softball Tournament (Joe)

•Looking for teams.

- •Rachael requested the announcement of the softball tourney from Joe.
- 7. Any New Business (Charlotte)
 - •Question of who might be able to paint lines on the field for the Challenger Soccer Camp (a Rec Program).
 - •Rachael will keep looking for someone to paint the lines.

Recreation Advisory Council

May 1, 2024

1. Participant Conduct Policy

- •Rachael emphasized keeping it simple and something that would be short enough that folks would actually read.
- •Joe commented that he wondered if it would make sense for the policy to limit warnings to one.
- •Rachael asked if the level of warning be different for youth versus adult—i.e. An adult should know better and so would only get one warning.
- •Brent suggested that maybe discretion could be used in applying the appropriate number of warnings based on the person's age.
- •Rachael also wondered if the "Respect in Rec." preamble to the policy would be good to read before games.

- •Charlotte suggested sending it with the pre-season communication that goes out from coaches.
- •Rachael also wondered about posting the policy at Treasure Island. There was broad support for that.
- •Rachael will work with Town Manager, Brian Story, to consider the council's suggestions and draft what they think makes sense. Ultimately, it's their decision and we are just here to advise.

2. Planning for Next Year's Budget

A. Cal Ripken

•Cal Ripken has a lot of rules for parent participation, and a lot of requirements around

paying dues in order to be covered by insurance.

•In our case, however, Brian said that town insurance would cover situations that might

emerge.

•Rachael wondered about pulling Rookies and T-ball out of Cal Ripken—primarily

because of cost and the ability to do it on our own.

•You would still be able to play games, but you wouldn't have the restrictions of

background checks (Brian said there is a mechanism to do our own) and other expenses.

•Megan observed that Rookie games are important, but as long as we don't lose the

opportunity to play those games, it would be fine not to be part of Cal Ripken at that

Level. (The upper levels would remain part of Cal Ripken.)

•Nicci also pointed out that travel for Rookies can be far and not necessarily logical—like

going to Rochester.

•Joe suggested we double check with Nate, Andy, and Stacy, who have been doing baseball for awhile, just to make sure that we aren't

missing anything and that we wouldn't lose anything by pulling T-ball and Rookies from Cal Ripken.

B. Hours for Rachael/Friends of Rec.

- •There is much to do, and much that Rachael would like to do.
- •What she needs to do is more than a 20 hour per week job.
- •This is one of the reasons Rachael wondered about a "Friends of Rec." (fundraising) group.
- •Brent asked what it would take to increase the Rec. budget.
- •Joe suggested Rachael document what she spent her hours on each week, and also the work that she didn't get to each week (that she would have liked to have gotten to).
- •Then the Rec Council could make a recommendation to the Selectboard in terms of increasing the Rec. Budget.
- •In terms of Friends of Rec. we'll look at other ways for folks to donate, perhaps a tab that someone can select on the website.
- •Rachael will explore this (and other ideas around fundraising) with Brian.

C. New Business

- •Rachael asked for recommendations on who might be able to build a baseball batter's box template.
- •Joe suggested speaking with Andy McGovern
- •Brent reported that the Thetford Trails Team now has the Upper Valley Trails Alliance as a fiscal sponsor
- •There is an agreement between Upper Valley Mountain Biking Association and UVD (Army Corps) to maintain trails in Union Village.
- •There is also an agreement between the Thetford Trails Team to have two members represented on the Upper Valley Mountain Biking Association.

1. Welcome prospective new members (Joe and Charlotte)

- •Charlotte invited new members to introduce themselves.
- •Nicci Maynard, Mary Dan Pomeroy, and Megan Lavik introduced themselves and explained

their interest in the Rec. Council

2. Parent conduct policy (Rachael Cook)

- •Rachael explained the background to the need for the policy: bad behavior by some parents in Lyme.
- •Rachael expressed an interest in a clean, simple, clear-cut, and effective policy.
- •The question is how do you enforce a policy; she doesn't want the coaches to have to do enforcement.

- •She would like to be able to say to coaches that if behavior is unacceptable, they can pull their team from the field/court, etc.
- •Nate pointed out that it is easier to enforce in some venues—like a basketball game—than in others (like soccer fields, and baseball fields).
- •Mary Dan, there needs to be an interim step—a warning for behavior that doesn't rise to the level of removal, but needs to be a warning.
- •Next Steps: Rachael is going to draft a policy and work with Brian to confirm what we can and can not do in terms of enforcement.

3. **Running/Hiking Group** (guest, Liba Hladik)

- •Liba is interested in creating a group that might get together periodically to walk/run/hike
- •Rachael said that she is working on a survey to gauge interest in ideas like this
- •She will send it out this weekend and then we'll be able to see who is interested in doing what and help those groups form

4. Approval of minutes from January 29 meeting (Joe and Charlotte)

- •Brent moved to approve the minutes.
- •Charlotte seconded.
- Motion passed.

5. Meeting Schedule (Joe and Charlotte)

- •Every other month feels good to people in terms of cadence.
- •First Wednesday of every other month.
- •7:00 will be the meeting time.
- •Next meeting will be Wednesday, May 1st.

6. VT Bike and Brew resident's discount day (Jonas Cole, guest)

- •Jonas joined us at 7:50.
- •Jonas asked what our charge is as the Rec. Advisory Council.
- •Jonas is proposing a discount for Thetford residents.

- •Weekend in May for Thetford Residents (Thetford locals day).
- •Another idea would be community rides for Thetford residents, e-bikes, 5 or 10 miles, say "hey" to your neighbors.
- •Rachael mentioned that there is interest in having a day when Treasure Island is free. She

wondered if we might have a Thetford kind of day where we have free or discounted activities. •Rachael also suggested maybe the library could have coupons for Thetford Residents, etc.

- •Jonas is amenable to that.
- •Jonas is interested in making a full weekend of Thetford–not just one day.
- •Rachael and Jonas can work out the details with input from Brian around insurance, etc.

7. Other Business

- •Rachael expressed a concern that Rec. Director is not a 20-hour-a-week position.
- •There are a lot of meetings that she wants to attend, and she does (because she is learning so much).
- •But she is so far over her hours that she is pushing them into the next week and is always behind.
- •The new budget will not be planned until November.
- •Joe suggested tracking hours so you can demonstrate a need for increased hours.
- •Charlotte suggested tracking what programs you want to create, too, so that you can also demonstrate a need for additional hours.

- •Stacy nominated Joe and Charlotte as co-chairs.
- •Brent seconded.
- •Minutes approved by vote.

3. Renewal of terms for two members.

•Tabled for now.

4. Vacancies on the Advisory Council.

- •Stacy pointed out that a number of members might be looking to step off in the not-too-distant future, due to the fact that their children are aging out of current Thetford Rec activities.
- •Discussion of the process for adding new members to the Rec. Advisory Council.
- •Joe will follow up with selectboard and town manager for clarification about the process.

5. Update from the Rec. Director.

•Started work right before basketball. Went to meeting with other towns to set up basketball schedules. People were very helpful.

- •Then had to find coaches for the season. The 5th/6th girls at TES recruited and found their own coaches.
- •Coaches have worked out well.
- •5/6 Girls wanted to get better at basketball, but didn't want to play games.
- •These 6 girls have been able to do something physical and it's been nice to tailor it to exactly what they wanted to have.
- •Other Rec. Directors have been really helpful to Rachel.
- •Skiing has been running smoothly, despite the weather.
- •Stacy passed along a compliment that she heard from another parent. The parent appreciated Rachael being there on the first day of skiing and added that she is doing a great job.
- •Rachael went to meeting for Cal Ripken. Stacy was there and is happy to help Rachael navigate baseball.
- •Rachael is also working on a survey to the town to see what recreation activities are of interest she's looking to expand recreation offerings to age groups beyond elementary school and to the broader Thetford population in general.

6. Anticipated needs for the upcoming baseball/softball season.

- •Stacy offered to continue to be a resource for Rachael as the baseball season unfolds.
- •Rachael wants to understand some of the terms around baseball—Cal Ripken, fall ball, "U" teams, etc.
- •Stacy pointed out the kids who are qualified and can help with umpiring
- •Rachael sent out a Doodle Poll to baseball folks so that she can meet with them and so they can share more about the baseball world with her.

7. New Business.

- A. Family Center Idea
- •Rachael shared that she wanted to eventually create a family center in Thetford that would focus on activities for young families.
- •She feels that the two roles would work well together, with the family center serving a specific population and the Recreation position serving a larger/broader population.
- •Her working name for it is the Kindred Village Center.
- B. Challenger Program is booked and space reserved for the summer. Rachael is advertising through the Rec. Dept.
- C. Joe mentioned that it would be good if summer ball games played away on Tuesdays so as not to conflict with summer fun runs at Thetford Academy every Tuesday.
- D. Circus Camp is at TES in February (break). Unfortunately, sign-ups are not robust. One concern that Rachel has is that the cost seems high. She is feeling a little conflicted about pushing a program that is so expensive. Stacy and Charlotte suggested that one of the reasons sign-ups might be low is because camp was announced kind of late and families probably already made plans. We should continue to pursue this opportunity and not let low numbers deter the program from offering the camp in future years.
- E. Stacy asked about whether we would have meetings on a regular basis—quarterly? Monthly? Joe and Charlotte will discuss. Wednesday was the preferred day of the week in the past.

1. Ski Program

- Dave and Lisa Harmon have volunteered for several years for the ski program
 - Would like to meet with Amy in the next week to discuss roles and responsibilities for what they should do v. what the rec director does
 - Goals: Want to develop an operations plan to hand off to future rec directors and ski coordinators. Want to foster a fun, safe environment that supports volunteers and retention.
 - Want to secure a good participant/instructor ratio
 - Working with other parents to develop a program handbook covers participant expectations, guidance for coaches (may seem routine, but needs to be restated) and guidance for lodge parents
 - May see record numbers in registration this year, since school will not be offered on Friday afternoons.
 - If we don't have enough volunteers, how will we handle that? Cancel the program? Waitlist?
 - Bernice has asked rec to come up with an alternative for kids

- who don't want to ski, however, that is too short notice and not enough volunteers.
- Amy has guidance written that will be out by Friday morning (12/2) including ski dates, guidance, rules, etc. Dave and Lisa are willing to help with soliciting volunteers.
- Amy will also post on the listserv for ski instructions.
- Historically, first year skiers need to have a parent at the ski-way for at least the three weeks.
- Group thoughts: If we need to make reduce the size of the program, perhaps we do the following:
 - Limit by grade
 - Put on a waitlist
 - Can we put out a notice to let people know that they MAY not be able to participate as soon as possible?
 - Deadline for registration for ski Fridays is 12/16. Is this enough time for parents to make an alternate plan?
 - Last year there were 122 participants and 20 volunteers
 - Disclaimer to go into the email announcing the ski program regarding size limit and parent involvement for first timers.
 - There is a liability coverage question Amy will look into it and ask the ski way and town manager.
- Next steps: Amy, Dave and Lisa will find a time to meet offline.

 - There are six 3/4 girls signed up. There is a parent willing to help, but is not ready to coach.
 - We will need to reach out to people in our networks.

4. Ski Sale

equipment than it used to be. TIme would be better spent doing a fund-raiser. There is gear still in the garage at TI.

1. Approval of 5/19/2021 Minutes

• Motion to approve by Andy McGovern, Charlotte seconded the motion. Minutes approved.

2. U13 Fall Baseball Issue

- Rec created a fall baseball registration for a team for this age group
- Jolene and Brent Cadwell requested a second team be put through Rec
- Concern about this because it would set a precedent that people could put teams through Rec that weren't really Rec programs.
- Formation of a team outside of Rec, they want to go through Rec to avoid the fees charged by TA
- Bryan feels that we should not pull in a team to do this, even if a prior rec director had done this

- Offered to have all 20 kids who are registered in Rec to be split evenly on two teams, which would include the players from the 'new team'. No need for another coach.
- Disagreement about when registrations were due. One party believed rosters were due by the 14th, but registration through Thetford Rec was open through the 20th. Closed early without notice. After the registration was closed, Amy notified Brent that if others still wanted to sign up, to let her know and she would re-open the registration for a short period of time.
- Disagreement about deadline for rosters vs. charter and dues. One party argued that the only hard deadline for last week was for charter registration and dues. Rosters are not due until later this month.
- Cadwells have concerns about opportunities for kids. For years, Babe Ruth played at TA with no cost. That changed last year, so the team was registered through Rec. It was formed prior to registering through Rec.
- Nathan Maxwell made many decisions about baseball without Rec Advisory Committee input.
- TA charges \$175 to use the field for 3 hours, plus \$150 for lining the field.
- Nathan started the program last year, registration was open to anyone. Babe Ruth team was a Rivendell and Thetford team. Team was called Orange County Crushers. If more kids join the team, this is the team they would join.
- Why did Thetford join a different Babe Ruth league? Commissioner told them they had to join the other league, because we fall within a different boundary. Now that there was a revived Babe Ruth team, we had to go through TC. Went through the state process.
- Discussion about processes and specific teams available over the summer.
- There was one sign up link. Babe Ruth/Fall Ball link and Fall Ball/Summer team. For the kids who wanted to play summer and fall ball, they could continue. Some just played summer and some will just play fall. Registrations for these teams were put together all at the same time.
- Registration fees should be based on Resident and Non-Resident. That did not happen, which was a mistake.

- Last year, John Brown, head of Maintenance, told Nathan that as long as they were associated with Thetford Rec they would not have to pay the fees.
- There are no regional boundaries for fall ball. It does not need to be through a town. It is purely for fun. The team that was formed was formed through the kids, not the adults.
- Policy Issues:
 - This is not a new precedent, precedent was set last year.
 - Who coaches? How do we make that decision?
 - How do the teams get created if there is a need for more than one team at an age level?
- It is probably not a good idea to have any youth sports programs after grade six go through the Rec. Everyone agrees that Babe Ruth should not operate through Rec.
- Concern that policies shouldn't be made midstream; if issues arise all decisions should be made by consensus.
- Uniforms are paid for through the fees collected.

3. Fall Youth Sports (Soccer, Cross Country, Baseball)

- Soccer: Lots of registrations. Lots of shirts, but what do we want to do with uniforms? Not in a good place. Is there funding available for uniforms? Use the Paw Print shirts for K-2, buy new soccer uniforms this year. Look to the budget to confirm. Can we find a sponsor? Look into that. Soccer Swap Day? Maybe in Thetford Center, TES, TI?
- Should Open Fields students who do not live in Thetford be allowed to play through Thetford Rec? Decision made: Open Fields students can join Thetford program.
- Should players from other towns register for Thetford Rec if there is a team available in their own town? No, per UVRA.
- Cross Country TA is offering cross country to 5th and 6th graders. Will not be offered through Rec.
- Baseball There will be U10 and U12 fall baseball teams. Need to make a decision about whether or not rec will sponsor anything past U12.

• Softball - maybe U10, U12 and U14 softball teams. In the works. It would have to be on Sunday's only. Field availability may be an issue.

4. Pre-K Soccer

2. Introduction of Mary who is the liaison to the Board.

3. Background for Mary from Sara:

 Lack of information from Selectboard, floundering a bit as a committee. When the Rec Director position was a more part time position, they needed more support. Nathan is full time, we don't have as much to do. We need a bit more direction from the Selectboard. We meet four times per year, but can meet more if needed.

4. Mary asks the question: why are you on the RAC?:

- Sara: Two kids, on since oldest was in kindergarten, long time coach, feel strongly about recreation for kids and community
- Andy: Young kids, involved with sports, coaching.
- Nate: Young kids involved in sports, coaching multiple seasons, give back.
- Stacy: Same as everyone else
- Stefanie: kids are involved in sports, a way to help and support the sports community for the kids

5. Baseball:

 Postponed until now, started practice for minors tonight. Hour long practice. Majors start tomorrow. Hoping to start with the younger kids next week. Nathan needs to be at first practice to make sure health

- precautions and guidelines are followed. Will have sanitizer in the dugout soon.
- Games will be able to start July 1. Only hurdle will be what the state allows for who will be allowed at the game. 25 max. If that's the case, we can have away games where there is great internet service to stream games.
- 12 kids per major and minor teams. Rookie team will have ~9. Good sized k-1 team. At this point, the focus is getting kids out throwing and batting.

6. Treasure Island:

- Will open Monday. Will be open 10-7 M, W, F, Sa, Su. Tu and Th will be reserved for recreation activities. Baseball teams and families will be allowed to go then.
- Tu and Th will be recreation days, hopefully many people in town will be able to access TI.
- Blocks of time to have groups of people to come for 1.5 hours as "swim teams." \$15 for the summer. Sign up your group and you can go for an hour and a half for the summer.
- Swim lessons. One lesson in the summer. Hour long session; half hour of swim lesson and half hour family time. On Tuesday and Thursday.
- Camps: Art camp will be difficult with no tables. This might happen at TES. Outdoor exploration will still happen. Hoping to do a kayak camp with Bonna Weiler.
- Many rec depts in the Upper Valley have cancelled their camps, but Lebanon and Hanover have not, so Nathan is working with them to see how they are working. Nathan is also working with the Aloha Foundation to make sure there is consistency.
- Nathan thinks that TI will either be really busy every day, but if it dies
 off, he is willing to rethink what can be done, and may potentially
 offer season passes.
- Equity: It is good that there is an option for people to apply for subsidy.

- Trying to push checks and credit cards so that there is limited contact.
 However, if people move to this, the cost may be able to be reduced.
 Initially came out in multiples of \$5 for ease of payment.
- Nathan could use help posting notices to the listserv. Sara will help with this.
- Q: Limiting access might cause an equity issue. Is there a way to control how long people stay? Do we need to do this? A: There will be signs asking people to consider staying for a little while and leave to be considerate of others. No picnic tables, no playgrounds, no docks. Kids can't play in groups. The group that comes together can be together, but you cannot play with other families. Fifty is the max that can be at Treasure Island.
- Q: Are employees enforcing the rules? A: Yes. Nathan thinks the first
 two weeks are going to be the most difficult. People aren't going to
 like the price or the lack of amenities. Although there is less for
 people to do, there is a lot more cleaning to be done, so it is not really
 less for more.
- Bathroom updates: There are touchless paper towel dispensers and soap dispensers.
- Suggestions for signage.
- Tried to have passes, but that just didn't work with the number of people who had passes last year. Tried lots of different ways, and it just didn't work logistically.
- Q: Can we limit just to Thetford residents? A: Hard to do this. If it becomes a problem, but we need to see how it goes. Going to have to troubleshoot as we go.
- RAC is happy to help out the Rec Director when he needs it.
- Bizzy bodies will be there on Tuesdays, Jill Cray will do yoga on Thursdays. Nathan could use help from RAC to brainstorm more adult activities on that day. Is it worth putting on the Thetford Bulletin Board? Volleyball? Horseshoes? Pickleball?

- Q: Can we rent out the island or create a facility on the island?
 Pavilion is there and just needs to be put in on the island, can include a deck, need a shoreline protection permit. Permit is ready to go.
- Mary: Idea: Refurbished the Rice's Mill one room schoolhouse (grants, sweat equity, etc.), did the same thing with the Thetford Hill Church. Could we do the same with TI' Toured Treasure Island; lots that need to be replaced or are out of code. Want to get some skilled carpenters and professionals to see if we can set up a community work day to come and make repairs on Treasure Island.
- Sara: We used to have a work day there years ago. It's a great idea.
 There has been a lot of movement to improve TI in the past, and it gets to a certain point and then it stalls.
- Nathan has gotten recommendations for creating a master plan for TI from planners in Burlington. Soon he will seek donations from the town to fund this master plan. It will include what could and should be done at TI, as well as revenue generators.
- We have not had a lot of support from the Selectboard, and never had a town manager, mostly due to priorities and turnover. Maybe this is the time we can change that.
- Really want to figure out how to make TI a place that is a great place for the town, not just as a beach, but also for other social events.
- If we come up with a good master plan, we can introduce it to the town and hope that people make donations to support it. There are also grants that can help to finance.

7. Fall Sports:

- Very unclear what will be the situation in the fall because of COVID-19.
- We will plan like the seasons will happen so we are ready to go, but will be prepared to cancel if needed.

- May need to come up with a new mission statement if there is a new title, but those conversations are to be held in the future. Will need this to talk about the mission and goals of RAC committee.

Projects

- Trying to make the green area across from the Village Store more community friendly. Need a place for younger kids during school hours. Create a mission/goal for this green space.
- Timothy Frost building 3-4 plans but nothing set yet. Would be nice to see it as a community building for adults and kids alike. Perhaps a theater facility. Heat but no bathroom.
- Treasure Island: Front patio area in front of the bath house, bathrooms will be revamped, stalls will be updated.
- Commissioner roles have worked well this year. If we can't find a "commissioner" we can look to have team parents. However, now that Nathan is full time most issue can and should handle things that come up.

Skiing

- Lots of kids signed up.
- Lots of volunteers (five from the community). There was a little struggle with the Kindergarten group because it is not an instructional program. Also need to spend a little bit of time helping parents classifying their child as a skier. Thought send a poll to parents and record data for next year.

Baseball

- T-Ball, Rookie, Minors and Majors Teams.
- We have plenty of coaches and lots of kids signed up.
- Lyme will not have a majors team, and a weak minors team. We will get some Lyme kids on the majors team.

- Strafford parents have reached out to see if there would be room on our teams if they cannot field teams.
- If we can't find a "commissioner" we can look to have team parents. However, now that Nathan is full time most issues can and should handle things that come up.

Softball

- Only two sign ups (one minor and one major). Fourteen signed up last year. Cal Ripken is very watered down and this may be a turn off to players. Girls can also play baseball. Girls on the Run is also happening. 6th graders may also be able to join the track team.

Lacrosse

- Instructional lacrosse is also an option. Problem that you run into with lacrosse is that there is no high school team. Another problem is equipment. There is interest, but not sure how much. Idea to run a pilot program to have skills sessions and see what the turn out would be. Getting equipment would be a challenge, but not insurmountable.

Mountain Bike Trail

- \$8200 assessment to overlook the property and give us a good idea of what we can do. Trying to do a five town connection. Look at all the trails there that need to be expanded, closed down, etc. Need mapping to be done. VAST and Army Corps of Engineers have been a great resource. Still working on creating a contiguous network of land. Working with several stakeholders, including Upper Valley Trails Alliance, TA, Thetford and Rec.
