MLB: Texas Rangers vs Pittsburgh Pirates (-105) - 6:40pm ET

Analysis:

Based on the current form and stats of both pitchers and teams, we believe this game is likely to stay under the 7.5 total. Texas' deGrom has been exceptional with a 2.19 ERA and a WHIP of 0.91 over 14 starts, regularly inducing ground balls at a rate of 43.3%, which helps limit big innings. Burrows, with a 4.24 ERA and a WHIP of 1.33 over five starts, tends to give up more home runs - 1.54 per nine innings - and his ground ball rate is around 40.3%, suggesting he can still contain the hitters to some extent. Offensively, Texas struggles on the road with a batting average of .229, and Pittsburgh hasn't been much better lately, batting just .153 over their last five games with a bullpen ERA of 3.38. Burrows tends to perform better at home, and Pittsburgh's recent bullpen performance supports the idea of limited scoring. Texas's bullpen has also been strong recently with a 2.05 ERA over their last six games. Historically, Texas is 12-2 to the under against NL teams hitting .245 or lower, and Pittsburgh has gone under in six of their last nine home games, all of which further reinforce the likelihood of a low-scoring game. Considering these trends, the effective pitching, and the low offensive productivity from both sides, I see this game staying well below the total, making the under the smarter play here. The public bets are against us as 81% of the bets and 74% of the money are on the game going over.

MLB: Astros vs Angels - 1 Unit (-105) - 9:38pm ET

Astros -1.5

Analysis:

The Angels just ended their win streak. Historically when that happens they tend to lose again. The Angels starter, Yusei Kikuchi, who will be facing his former team - at least for the second half of last season has been inconsistent in recent play. Last Sunday in Baltimore, he was tagged for five runs and seven hits over 5 2/3 innings in an 11-2 loss. This makes him a less reliable option against a Houston lineup that, despite being cooled off briefly by the Athletics last night, still has strong offensive potential. The Astros, particularly behind Hunter Brown, are always a threat. Brown has been in excellent form, winning his last four starts and posting a stellar 1.47 ERA in June, indicating he's in top shape and capable of shutting down the Angels' offense. Given the Angels' tendency to falter after a win streak, their recent struggles, and Brown's recent dominance, the Astros seem poised to take control of this game. Therefore, backing Houston on the run line at -1.5 - is the smart play. **The public agrees as 71% of the bets and 87% of the money are on the Astros to cover.**
